Abstract: An anti-apartheid activist in the 1980s, Jean de la Harpe was involved in administrative work for

the United Democratic Front (UDF). She also prepared funding proposals, budgets and reports for funders, and prepared much of the UDF's resource material. Her fundraising skills were applied

during campaigns within the African National Congress (ANC).

### Introduction

Jean de la Harpe was an anti-apartheid activist in the 1980s. She was involved in administrative work for the United Democratic Front (UDF), an organisation often viewed as the internal wing of the African National Congress (ANC). De la Harpe also prepared funding proposals, budgets, and reports for funders. She equally wrote annual reports and prepared much of the UDF's resource material. Her fundraising skills were also used during campaigns within the ANC, once the party was unbanned.

The collection includes publications, pamphlets, posters, flyers, booklets, tapes, videocassettes, and proposals for voter education.
