Pathfinder Officers to be recognised as Deputy Camp Chiefs for training Pathfinder Officers, and so that their certificates may be recognised by Gilwell Park.

It was agreed that as the Training and qualifications for Deputy Camp Chiefs was still being considered by the Headquarters Council, this recommendation was rather premature.

OFFICERS TRAINING COURSE

After a long discussion it was agreed to hold an Officers Training Course at Orlando Township, Johannesburg during the Easter Holidays next year. The Secretary was instructed to inform the Editor of the "Pathfinder" that this Course is open to KKK Pathfinder Officers from all Divisions.

PATHFINDER CAMP It was agreed that as the Officers Training Course is more important than a Pathfinder Camp, the proposed camp for Pathfinders at Heidelburg next year should be postponed indefinitely.

SENIOR PATHFINDERS A recommendation was received from the Pathfinder Masters in Pretoria suggesting that senior Pathfinders be called "Roamer Pathfinders". It was agreed to forward this recommendation to the Divisional Council.

REORGANISATION OF ADMINISTRATION

It was agreed that an Executive Committee be held in the train to Bloemfontein for the purpose of considering a report from Messrs Rathebe, Sykes and Gauntlett re the reorganisation of the administration in the Transvaal. The Division having grown so large that the present system is totally inadequate.

MEETING OF THE DIVISIONAL COUNCIL It was agreed to call a meeting of the Divisional Council for Tuesday, 13th. December to consider matters for the meeting of the Headquarters Council at Bloemfontein on the 17th. December.

UNIFORM AND BADGES

It was agreed to recommend to the Headquarter Council that a sub-committee be appointed to consider the question of scarves and uniforms and to draw up designs for the new badges for all branches of the Movement.

PATHFINDER STRENGTH The Secretary was instructed to have a report of the number of troops, officers and Pathfinders ready for the Divisional Council Meeting.

The Chairman thanked Mr Rathebe, as secretar of the B.M.S.C for the use of the room for the meeting.

UNIFORM AND BADGES It was agreed to recommend that the suggestion be forwarded to the Headquarters Council that a sub-committee should be formed to consider the question of uniform and badges for the new branches.

FINANCE There was an approx. balance of £90 as at 14/11/32

D.P.M. FOR THE WITWATERSRAND It was agreed to recommend that Mr Bacon be temporarily appointed as D.P.M. for the Witwatersrand for the first three months of next year.
