

MEMORANDUM ON A. SETAKGE. M/DET/CONST. (79).

Witness reports on meeting, No. 118, p. 2751 (V.14), ex. G. 191. He is obviously very uneducated his notes are ungrammatical in the extreme and contain a lot of drivel.

Witness says the day was windy, he could not catch everything that was said, that he was not writing comfortably as he was standing when making notes.

Compare the report of this meeting (No 118) by the witness with the minutes in which Mokoena reported the same meeting on Ex G. 194

p. 2755 & 6. (V.14). He obviously missed a great deal as the meeting lasted 3 hrs. and was recorded by him on 2 pages of typescript. See ex. G. 191. ~~2~~

He says he cannot understand everything that is said either in Xosa, Zulu, or Southern Sotho. p. 2660 & 1, (V. 14). If the interpreter interprets from one African language into another he, the witness, does his own translation into English.

The witness's notes contain numerous alterations made in ink although the body of the notes is written in pencil. p. 2775 (V.14). The witness is obviously lying when he says he made all alterations at the meeting and whilst it was in progress. See x-examination hereon, p. 2766 to 2769, and 2774 & 5 (V.14) and p. 2778 (V.14).

At 2777 (V.14). witness says that A.N.C. often provided an interpreter for him so that police should hear and understand fully what was said, but compare Mokoena's evidence at p. 2785. (V.14). See also contradiction between witness' and Mokoena in regard to the use of interpreters. pp. 2776 & 2785. (V.14).

This is a thoroughly unsatisfactory and unreliable witness - but that which he reports does not appear/....

appear to be of importance.
