The total amount paid in membership fees during 1971 was R274-00. The number of members, fully paid, at 31st December, 1971, was 137.

ACTIVITIES

During 1971 the following activities took place :-

Body-Building. Many young men were attracted to this activity and weight-lifting equipment was provided for them.

Boxing. This remained a very popular sport.

Judo. This activity was popular.

Billiards and Snooker. Men of all ages used the two billiards tables and contributed to the Centre's funds to the extent of R147-60.

Table-tennis. Young members continued to play this game.

Ballroom Dancing. The B.M.S.C. school of ballroom dancing is famous. There has always been a high standard of ballroom dancing at the B.M.S.C.

SOCIAL AMENITIES

The B.M.S.C. continued to be the venue for many organisations that used it for their meetings. Among these were sporting clubs, burial societies, social workers, health inspectors, choral groups and dance bands.

HIRE OF HALL

The hall was hired to various associations for fund-raising functions and to private individuals for parties and wedding receptions. The income from the hire of the hall and the rent of rooms and lockers amounted to R1.229-60.

STAFF ACCOMMODATION

The African Boys Scouts Association and the Transvaal Association of Non-European Boys and Girls Clubs both hired office accommodation at the Centre during the year.

RESTAURANT

Nourishing meals were provided in the restaurant at a very low cost.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The B.M.S.C. continued to be governed by an Executive Committee, duly elected by members.

CLOSURE OF ELOFF STREET PREMISES

At the end of December, 1971, the Club House at 3a Eloff Street was closed by order of the City Council and in conformity with the requirements with the Department of Bantu Administration and Development, thus bringing to an end approximately fifty years of activity at that site. It was with great regret that the Executive Committee and Members had to accept that the Bantu Men's Social Centre could no longer remain active on the present site, but a petition was submitted through the City Council of Johannesburg to the Minister of Bantu Administration and Development asking for the establishment of a new Bantu Men's Social Centre in Soweto. In the meantime all activities of the Bantu Men's Social Centre ceased at 31st December, 1971.

We express our thanks to our generous donors and subscribers, especially to the Johannesburg City Council, the Department of Bantu Administration and Development, the N.R.C. and the Deferred Pay Interest Fund.

Special mention should be made of the invaluable services rendered for many years by the firm of Howard Pim and Hardy and to Mr. J.M. Pim who has been the Hon. Treasurer for many years. Our sincere thanks are also due to Messrs. MacKinnon, Anderson and Company, the Auditors.

NOTES ON THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1971

- NOTE 1 The lease of the premises having been terminated at 31st December, 1971, and the billiard tables stored, at that date the Billiards Reserve Fund of R200 has been transferred to Accumulated Funds.
- NOTE 2 The Neon Sign valued at R360 when it was donated to the Centre by Claude Neon Lights (S.A.) Limited has been written off against the credit balance of that amount.
- NOTE 3 The bequest from the late Catherine Fell Drysdale was used to purchase major items of equipment for the Centre. As the building has closed down and all the equipment has been sold since the end of the year the object for which it was held separate no longer exists. Therefore the balance has been transferred to Accumulated Funds.
- NOTE 4 As no money was received during the year from the former secretary, the amount owing by him has been written off against the reserve for possible non-payment of the monies misappropriated, created during the year end 31st December, 1970.
