From November 28th 1937.
To September 30th 1941.

Advent Sunday. Sung Mass & a.m. Sister Dorothy Joan left by November 28th the 9:35 a.m. train. Mother drove her to the station in the car. Elizabeth Brooks in Pretoria Solemn Evening & Scornum. 6-15 p.m. A very hot day.

Monday.

Vigil.

November 29th

Mass 7-15. A day of Intercession for Foreign Missionaries. Sister Olive Frances in Pretoria.

Mrs Brooks left & Mother took her to the station in the car for the 2-30 p.m. train. Evening 6-45 p.m. not Solemn as the Chaplain went into the School.

Tuesday.

Fri. S. Andrew A.M. Johannesburg & took the Mass, as the November 30th Chaplain went to the School to

Kaie the Mass for the Children's Communions. Fr. Evans saw M^r Lewis after breakfast & left about 9 a.m. At 2 p.m. Mother, Sister Marjorie, & Miss Case went into Pretoria to the Bishops for a Meeting of the Hues.

M^r Lewis also came in to see Dr. Dutoit. All returned at 5-30 p.m. Sister Edith Ridan in Pretoria.

Wednesday.
December 1st

No Mass. A dull day & about 12 o'clock rain started. After Sext Mother went out in the car with Sister Marjorie to practice various things. Mother went to bed after Vespers for a long rest. Girls service at 6-30 p.m.

Thursday.
December 2nd

Mass 7-15. At 10 a.m. Elza was baptized, a Solemn Baptism. The Household was present. A very cold day after rain all night & it rained off & on during the day. The first rehearsal

of the Christmas Play took place at 6.30 p.m.
Mother & Sister Marjorie doing it with the
Girls. Mother had a car lesson after tea.

Friday.
Mass 7-15. Another dull cold day, and

December 3rd. inclined to rain. At 10 a.m. Mother the
Assistant, Sister Ethel Irene, and Sister

Flora Mary started in the car to
Government House having been invited
to Morning Tea & to see the gardens.

Her Excellency Lady Duncan was de-
lightful & showered cut flowers &
plants for the Irene garden upon us.

All returned at 1-30 p.m. with the
car laden with spoil! & the after-
noon was spent in drying flowers, &
planting plants! Classes as usual
6-4.5 p.m. Miss Elliot came to stay.

Saturday.
December 4th.
Mass 7-15. At 10 a.m. Thirteen of the
Goville School children came to the
Homes for their usual Christmas visit
and brought some very nice things
& a cheque for £2. They had Morning
Tea & went to all the houses,
leaving at 11-30. A better day
no rain & the sun came out
after tea. Evening & Devotions 6-30.

Advent II.
December 5th.
Song Mass. 7 a.m. Miss Case left for her
holiday by the 12 o'clock train, Mother
drove her to the station. A good
deal of rain in the morning then
it cleared up & started to rain
again at supper time. Evening
& Sermon 6-30 p.m.

Advent II.
December 5th. Song Mass 7 a.m. Miss Case left for her
holiday by the 12 o'clock train, Mother
drove her to the station. A good
deal of rain in the morning then
it cleared up & started to rain
again at supper time. Evening
& Sermon 6-30 p.m.

Monday.

F. of St. Nicholas.
December 6th

No Mass. A very wet day, it rained all day. Sister Marjorie had her breakfast in bed. Sister Ethel Irene went into Pretoria in the Van with Matron Beatrice to do the girls Christmas shopping & got back at 1-15 p.m. No Recreation! Mother gave the time to the Sisters for Christmas letters, Sext & None 12 o'clock. Rehearsal of the Play 6-15 p.m. Sister Ethel Irene went to bed at 6-30 p.m. M^r Lewis in Retreat.

Tuesday.

December 7th

Mass 7-15. Father Evans came & gave an address & heard the Sisters confessions.

M^r Lewis was anointed by him in the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament & Mother & all the Sisters were present. Another wet day but it cleared in the afternoon about 4 p.m. Miss Elliot went to Johannesburg for the night.

Wednesday.

F. of the Conception.

December 8th

Sung Mass 7 a.m. Talking Morning Tea to which Mother went. Sext & None 12. At 2 p.m. Mother & Sister Marjorie went to Pretoria in the car Mother driving & Mother had her first lesson of driving in the traffic in Pretoria with one of Cannock's Men. After it, Mother & Sister Marjorie went to the School for tea & returned at 6-30 p.m. Crib special service 6-30 p.m. - A fine day.

Thursday.

December 9th

Mass 7-15. M^r Soames came to stay and arrived at 5-30 p.m. A rehearsal at 6-30 p.m.

Friday.

December 10th

Mass 7-15. Father Pierce Jones came for the night & arrived about 12 o'clock

The Chaplain put him up. He had tea in Town with Mother & Sister Marjorie; after tea Mother took him to see St. Margaret's. M^m Somes in Retreat. Classes as usual. A tremendous storm broke over Irene at 7 p.m. with torrential rain, thunder, lightning, rain & hail all going on at the same time.

Saturday.
December 11th

Mass 7-16: Father Prince Jones. He left soon after breakfast for Pectoria. M^m Somes also left at 9 a.m. in her car. Vespers after dinner as Mother & Sister Marjorie went into Pectoria for the Christmas Tree in aid of the Homes held at the Arcadia Parish Brown. They also went to the new Woolworths opened in Pectoria & got back at 6 p.m. Evening & Devotions 6-30 p.m.

Sunday.
Advent III.
December 12th

Sung Mass 7 a.m. Evening & Session 6 p.m. because Mother, Sister Marjorie, & Sister Olive Frances with several of the Mothers went in the Van to the Nativity Play at the School at 8 p.m. It kept fine & the Play was held out of doors.

Monday.

December 13th

Mass 7-15: Sister Ethel Irene, Sister Edith Aidan & Sister Hilary Clare went into Pectoria in the Van! At 2 p.m. Mother & Sister Marjorie went into Pectoria by car & took May & Emily. Mother had a lesson. All returned at 5-45 p.m. A rehearsal of the Play 6-15 p.m. The rest of the Sisters had supper early & went into Pectoria for the School Play leaving at 7 p.m. Miss Chapman & Miss O'Toole came to stay.

Tuesday.
December 14th
No Mass. Sister Ethel Irene had her breakfast
in bed. Miss Chapman in Retreat. At 2 p.m.—
Mother went to Fontaine in the car with
Sister Marjorie to see Sister Janet who
had taken the Prefects there. Sister Marjorie
went on into Pontoise to shop & returned
& had tea with Mother at Fontaine
& got back at 5 p.m. Miss Ridley came
at 12 o'clock for two nights.

Wednesday.
Mass 7-15. Sister Annette and Sister Eunice
arrived at 12 o'clock. Mother, with Sister
Ember Day. Marjorie went to the station in the car
to fetch them, Mother driving. Miss Chapman
and Miss Ridley in Retreat. Girls' special
service 6-30 p.m.

Thursday.
December 16th
Mass 7-15. Miss Chapman left at 10 a.m.
& Miss Ridley at 4 p.m. Mother & Sister
Marjorie spent the morning preparing
for Council & Chapter & arranging the
reading & music for the Holy Play.
Sister Annette went up to St. Margaret's
in the afternoon. A rehearsal of the
Play at 6-30 p.m.

Friday.
December 17th
Mass 7-15. Council & Chapter was
held. Council at 10-30 a.m. & Chapter
at 12 o'clock. All the School Sisters
arrived at 10-20 a.m. Sext & None
after Chapter. Vespers was at 6 p.m.
as all the Sisters went into their
Advent-Retreat. Miss Elliott returned
being brought back by M^{rs} Besson.

Saturday.
December 18th
Mass 7-30 a.m. All the Sisters in
Retreat which was taken by the
Chaplain. A lovely cloudy day

+ late. Evening + Devotions 6-45 p.m. +
the girls + household came.

Sunday.
Advent 15.
December 19th

Sung Mass 7 a.m. Several of the School
Sisters had dinner at 12-30 + went
to Johannesburg to see the Nativity
Play at Christ the King church
Sophiatown + to stay the night
to do shopping the next day. Sister
Joyce + Sister Dorothy Town stayed
on. Sister Hilary Clark went into
Johannesburg on the 10 a.m. train to
stay two nights with a friend. A
storm with heavy rain came up at
6-30 p.m. + went on most of the
evening. Evening + Devotions 6-45 p.m.

Monday.
December 20th

No Mass. No Recreations as the Christmas
presents were done up by the Sisters.
Sisters Olive Irene, Flora May, + Edith Adair
went into Pretoria to shop. Sister Joyce
+ Sister Dorothy Town returned to the School.
Rehearsal of the Play 6-30 p.m. Miss
Hewson arrived at 6 p.m.

Tuesday.
Feast St. Thomas Aquinas.
December 21st

Mass 7-15. At 9-45 a.m. Mother, Sister
Marguerite, Sister Annette, + Miss O'Toole all
went into Pretoria for final Christmas
shopping returning at 1-45 p.m. Miss
Hewson in Retreat.

Wednesday.
December 22nd

Mass 7-15. Father Evans came at 9-30
gave an address + heard the Visitors
and Sister confessors left at 1 p.m.
No special service but the girls had
classes at 6-45 p.m.

Thursday.
December 23rd

Mass 7-15. Miss Skinner came in the
morning to fetch Miss Hewson who

left. Sister Annette, Sister Ethel Irene, Sister Edith Didur & Sister Eunice went into Princeton on the train. Sister Annette to see Dr. Fahn who gave a bad report of her heart; they all returned at 1 p.m. A very busy day preparing for Christmas. This Living Stone arrived at 12 o'clock & Charlotte Pleasant at 6 p.m. Carol practice at 6-45 p.m. Mother had tea with Sister Annette.

Friday.
December 24th.
Christmas Eve.

Mass 7-15. Busy all day preparing for the Festival. A Christmas Tree by One lady; statue in Chapel for the first time; every one liked it. Sext & Nine 12 o'clock. Vespers at 5 p.m. Solemn Evensong & Provost 6-30 p.m. Compline 8-30 p.m. Nocturns 11. The Nixons called at 8 p.m. to see us & brightflowers; they only stayed a short time.

Saturday.
(Christmas Day).
December 25th.

A beautiful Mid night Mass, not very hot- lovely stars & a beautiful day until 4-30 p.m. when a terrific storm came on with torrents of rain. Everything as usual; Terce 9-30, Sext & Nine 12-30. Christmas Tree at the Nursery 10-30 a.m. followed by Morning Tea after which Mother went to St. Margaret's to see their decorations. Tea drink after dinner then everyone rested. All the School Sisters visited over at 3-30 p.m. & stayed for tea & Vespers; the latter at 4-30 p.m. followed by Carol singing to which the Crows came. After Vespers everyone set to &
