I always want to know, of course, but I always can wait. I'm not feeling like a martyr about this--I just really have some patience as far as you're concerned. (Too bad I can't develop it a bit more widely).

The news about Robert was good to hear. I can only hope that it will continue. And for you? You are so often in my thoughts and my concern is great, particularly at this time. If it does develop that you need any assistance from me, in whatever form it may take, please remember I want to had.

I am visiting my mother in Minnesota for a few days primarily to reassure her that I'm alright after getting my divorce in Mexico March 1. I left T at the beginning of lagt summer, living in sublet houses but I now own my own. The address is 988 Park Ave. Rochester, NY 14610. The divorce was delayed because we were working out the custody of the children. Fortunately they are almost young adults, except for Peter, and that makes things much easier, as I'm sure you know. Feter is a mongoloid and in school now but the arrangements about him were difficult. The result is joint custody which is what I wanted all along. Very few people have been ablt to understrand how I could do what I did after 25 years of marriage—and it's been hell—but I could no longer pretend a marriage if it wasn't and it wasn't-mithough, as you look around, that seems to be the name it's called. To overslymplfy, the emphasis on for rather than content seems to prevail. After years of psychoannlysis I have developed a different set of values and so I'm trying to live accordingly.
