to go which they were allowed to do as they had been both very unsatisfactory & showed no signs of wanting to be helped - he had a fearful scene with Mr. Ann - who wanted to go off at the same moment as Agatha, & while Agatha was in the very act of going - Mr. Ann climbed over her crib & pushed her way past S<sup>r</sup> Grace who tried to keep her in the dormitory & rushed out into the garden & was most abusive - S<sup>r</sup> G. went off to fetch a policeman & he soon arrived, meantime Mr. Ann dressed herself & tucked a bit & sat in her crib till such times as the S<sup>r</sup> in Charge could attend to her, & Agatha was got safely away by train to 9<sup>o</sup>'burg - with her baby Duncan - Mr. Ann went off with Marcus her baby - but where we know not - She was heard to direct the cabman to the Station, but we do not know where she really went - It was heartbreaking sending them away with their two poor babes - but they were aborning much here in the home - The magistrate was informed that these two
