I. Bokala (7) who refers to people of Argentina and calls upon people of Newclare to rise up. "Why do not rise up you poor slaves? We can see today world is marching to freedom. Here in S.A. you still speaking about freedom. Slavery is still in practise here". But he then goes on to request a million signatures for Freedom Charter esying "when we have received these signatures we shall let you know what are we going to do with these signatures".

Meeting held on 25/9/55 at the corner of Pollak Avenue and Hamilton Road, Newclare, Johannesburg. It was a meeting of the A.N.C.

Mmusi is again referred to as Mushi. It appears from the record that the fifth speaker was: I. Bokala, English; T. Mushi, Sesotho. This gives rise to the question whether Mushi spoke in Sesotho and his speech was translated into English by Bokala or whether Bokala spoke in English and Mushi translated his speech into Sesotho.

The speaker called on the audience to work for freedom. He stated that they must work hard to collect a million signatures. (This was presumably for the Freedom Charter.)
