

ONE of the muchvaunted "Indian" soccer teams of the

aprtheid era was Vredons Football Club.

This is part of our series on the history of old soccer clubs, which is brought to you courtesy of Gems Archives of veteran photographer Gopal Naransamy.

Vredons was founded by the late Reverend B L Sigamoney, a well-known community figure and activist of the time. The team's players came from Pageview, Malay Camp and Doornfontein. Rev. Sigamoney also founded the Vredons Cricket Club.

The captain of Vredons was Harry (Arumugam Padiachee) Morgan, a noted inside right who was selected at the age of 17 for the South African Indian XI against the All India touring team.

Another outstanding player was Aggie Poonen of the illustrious Poonen family of Vrededorp who had representatives in subsequent

teams in the Sam China Cup tournaments. He was a natural right halfback.

Another outstanding player was tennis star, Wesley Thomas. Although he hailed from Natal, he represented Transvaal on several occasions.

V Gopaul, who was nicknamed "Vella" because of his light complexion, was one of the teams' unfortunate players.

Through his soccer abilities he could have walked into the national team.

Kannaga (Ken) Pillay — now living in London — was a natural left half and is remembered for his ability against visiting teams.

The dynamite in small package was T (Tarzan) Naidoo. Despite his shortness, he feared no one and defenders dreaded him
