

Vorster to be questioned on Sobukwe

Cape Town, Monday.

QUESTIONS ABOUT THE FUTURE of Robert Sobukwe, national president of the former Pan-African Congress, will be asked in Parliament this week.

M.P.s want to know whether the Minister of Justice, Mr. Vorster, intends to curtail Sobukwe's activities when he leaves jail.

Sobukwe is serving a three-year sentence for inciting Africans to campaign against the pass laws and is due for release either on or before May 5.

DEMONSTRATIONS

Mr. M. I. Mitchell, M.P., for Durban North, said today he would ask Mr. Vorster about his plans for Sobukwe.

Mr. Mitchell wants to know when Sobukwe will be released, and whether Mr. Vorster intends to take action to curtail the activities and movements of Sobukwe—"if so what action and if not, why not?"

DENIED
