

# Harassment Durban.

A22-9.7

March 21

Paul Boule - Driver of an SAADF truck run up a pavement at him, while engaged in a picket stand. Verbally threatened and abused. 5 Days later he was assaulted by the same person in Wentworth. Registration of the vehicle was taken and charges laid ~~out~~, twice - the first docket couldn't be traced. Police unable to trace the ownership of the vehicle.

April/Play

Don Edwards and Gary Cullen. assaulted on two occasions on the same day ~~by~~ during a protest outside Lamontville, against Troop presence in Lamontville township. Assaultees believed the first 2 people to be employees of the Security brand.

The second assault by two black <sup>men</sup> who were provoked when asked if they were <sup>Lamontville</sup> community councillors, during an argument over the picket.

Charges were laid <sup>and a car registration provided</sup> however the police were unable to trace the vehicle.

April Aida Parker Newsletter sent to high schools.

Follows up with a fake letter of condemnation in ~~the~~ ECC Press officers name with forged signature. Very discrediting letter.

April

Raid on 2 flats of peripheral Kutchu Comm members. ~~Two people~~ Attempt to plant daga in the pore flat which failed. Two of the

Three people taken to Security Police headquarters and then ~~to~~ <sup>to</sup> Natal command where they were interrogated and lectured to for  $\pm$  3 hours on the evils of ECC and SADF's goodwill.

May April <sup>Bogus</sup> ~~Sneak~~ pamphlets + posters on campus about ECC focus week on militarisation advertising a seminar to explain the good points about <sup>the</sup> terrorism.

May/June. Security Branch threatened members of a punk band "Power age" because of the support for ECC.

\* Same day people from N. Command (one believed to Captain Nash of Intelligence) ripped up placards and stole a camera from an ECC photographer on the scene. These people seen ~~at the time to be~~ <sup>before the incident</sup> conversing with a SAP van parked up the road. The camera was later returned without spoil, having ~~to~~ apparently been found in a supermarket.

June <sup>Crash rel.</sup>  
House of a campus member was harassed.  
- 3 raids around June 16<sup>th</sup> period.  
- A series of strange phone calls in the early hours of the morning.  
- Houses 2 phones cut off from June 15-17.

October

Memorandum sent to all high schools telling principals to ~~inform~~ pupils that ECC planned to distribute pamphlets & badges at school gates. Pupils in assemblies were told not to accept these items. ECC was attacked in the process. Durban ECC had no such plans.

Nov 30

ECC members distributed pamphlets in town where they were verbally accosted by DMI & S.B. personnel. One pamphlet ripped out of their hands. Seems the objective was to foster a ~~image~~ of subversive & dangerous image of ECC in the way they were dealt with.

Referring to the same day, ~~we are aware~~ that the Umhlanga Rocks Protection Service (Civil Defence operation) ~~was~~ at and probably others were alerted to the fact that spurious fact that ECC was coming in to town to disrupt toy shops & throw all the merchandise into the streets if we found car toys.

These last two incidents if read against the backdrop of the Weekly Mail's expose of JMC's disinformation drive, could reflect (at the least) a new regional strategy of

June 17.

ecc campus office raided and ecc media

October

Natural Serviceman interrogated by Capt Nash

together at a party.

August. ~~27~~ 20-27.

street posters advertising a public meeting jointly  
hosted by ecc, were systematically pulled down  
On the third evening an incident <sup>eyes photographed</sup> in  
which a ~~car with a two way radio~~  
~~and two white male occupants~~ two white  
men were seen pulling the posters down. A  
two-way radio was used in the operation.  
A charge was laid, however the police felt  
there was insufficient evidence (in the poor  
quality photo's) for a docket to be opened.

October 1-7.

Posters advertising a rally jointly hosted by ecc  
were systematically pulled down. ± 400  
out of 500.

Another house (Halford rd.)  
(Kowloon + Finner)  
July. Raided. 2 ECC members questioned  
and media confiscated. (Kowloon)  
One person was threatened with detention. Raided by

2 MI members + one S.B.  
Media since lost and civil claim has been made.  
August

Halford rd "visited" by M.I. twice on  
consecutive Mondays

### Sir Duncan rd

- Raided on June 17<sup>th</sup> people at house  
(16 of them) Held and questioned for  
until 3.30 am -

- Two weeks of strange phone calls + people  
snooping around the garden late at night

- One further raid during this period.

- July 2. further raid and Sarah Hills  
detained. Substantial quantities of ECC  
media received. Media all lost or returned  
damaged. Claim for losses instituted

- ~~House~~ still Dalton Rd. June/July

Visited several times looking for Richard Steele.  
Marie Odendoot detained for not being able to  
divulge his whereabouts.

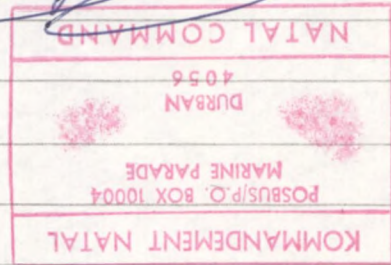
