went to funeral.

How Ray can be:

~~Joe~~: He believed he was going to be all right.

Joe: You meet a man under circumstances - you wd like to meet him under different circumstances, for you can see he is an exceptional person - to me it is a tragedy of fate that you can have people of this quality & Ray is not allowed to play his role. He was a handsome person, generous, warm, & intelligent.

He was so totally unnormal. He wasn't a black man & he didn't ^{feel} like a white man, & he was fair & person.
