Accused said:

3680 -- "We are awaiting a war and these same people here (i.e. police) are those who will cause war. + We are determined not to fight but they will cause all troubles which are still to come... We will die for our country.

-- When you fight in a struggle, do not look only at the nearest enemy, look at all white people. They, the oppressors, are playing with fire. One of these days guns will be of no use to them" etc.

After the accused were other speakers including Joseph Molefi (+) "we hope police will protect us and will do our best to help them".

and(- -) Motsile (not an accused) "the people want to govern this country and we are going to govern this country one day. I feel only another two years will pass before we have our freedom".
