Subject: Market Milk & Cream
Topic: Standardizing Milk and Cream

Standardizing of milk and cream is the process of lowering or raising the per cent of fat to suit the market.

That the sow does not make a hollow in the center of the pig. The sow should not have too much corn. She needs a variety of feed, plenty of milk, beets, potatoes, rutabagas, clover and root crops in general. Sawdust is fatal to little pigs. Bedding should be kept warm, dry and clean. The sow should not be fed anything the first day and on the 2nd or 3rd day feed her only sloppy or liquid food.

Skimmed milk is of the best feeds for young pigs. In absence of skimmed milk young pigs may be fed cut shorts middling or soaked corn made into slops. Without milk proper food and dry pan easily ^{get} stunted. A common disease of young pigs is diarrhea generally caused by improper food of the mother, or wet

A good remedy for scours for young pigs is to parch wheat flour and mix it with skimmed milk, one of the worse defects is the lack of strength. This can be remedied by proper food and exercise. Some diseases of hogs are contagious; and, when purchasing ^{hogs} is well quarantined them before you put them in the regular feed lock or where your hogs are kept. When little pigs are borne care should be taken

Infective period

Open lesion - infective agent is given off through body - through sputum, faeces -

Control diagnosis - clinically, bacteriological sputum or discharge - Tuberculin test.
