## Part-Time Classes for Non-Europeans.

### OBJECT.

To provide part-time classes in general education to non-Europeans at convenient centres within the area covered by the various branches of the Witwatersrand Technical College.

### ADMISSION.

Non-Europeans who have at least passed Std. V will be admitted, but the Council of the College reserves the right to refuse admission to any student on any grounds whatever, and without giving any reason for such refusal. Should there be sufficient demand and no other provision exists classes may be formed in lower grades.

### COURSES.

Courses in general education from Std. VI to the National Senior Certificate (Matriculation Exemption) of the Union Department of Education will be provided according to the demand and the available facilities.

The following subjects are offered tentatively:—

- Std. VI.** English, Afrikaans, Arithmetic, Geography, History.
- Std. VII.** English, Afrikaans, Arithmetic, Geography, Bookkeeping, Civics, History.
- Std. VIII.** English, Afrikaans, Arithmetic, Geography, a Native language, a Science subject, Bookkeeping.
- National Senior Certificate** (Matriculation Exemption) :  
English, Afrikaans, a Native language, Mathematics, History, Geography, Bookkeeping a suitable Science subject.

The number of subjects to be passed for the respective standards is as follows :—

**Standard VI.** Four subjects, including one official language.

**Standard VII.** Five subjects, including one official language.

**Standard VIII.** Six subjects, including one official language.

**National Senior Certificate** (Matriculation Exemption). Six subjects.

As regards the Matriculation Exemption course, the subjects selected must be in accordance with the grouping laid down. Part-time students are allowed to qualify by passing in the six prescribed subjects at two examinations, provided they pass in at least three subjects at the first examination and in all the remaining subjects at one subsequent examination.

Normally the full course for Standard VI may be covered in one year, but two years' study is considered necessary for the remaining courses.

#### **FEES.**

The yearly fees for the various courses will be half those normally charged, namely :—

**Std. VI.**—4 Subjects (full certificate) ..... £2 0 0

**Std. VII.**—5 Subjects (full certificate) ..... £2 10 0

**Std. VIII.**—National Junior Certificate—4 subjects **only** ..... £3 0 0

**National Senior Certificate** (Matriculation Exemption)—3  
Subjects only ..... £3 0 0

Single Subjects in any grade ..... £1 0 0

All fees are payable in advance, but by arrangement fees may be paid in instalments.

#### **BOOKS.**

Students are expected to provide themselves with the necessary textbooks and stationery.

#### **EXAMINATIONS.**

Examinations are held twice a year, in June and November, and students may enter for any subjects they feel qualified to write. Examination fees are payable before April 3rd and September 3rd for the respective examinations.

Details regarding the meeting places of the classes may be obtained from the Head of Department or Lecturer-in-Charge at each centre.

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
