Some time ago, after correspondence with me, you very kindly agreed to an arrangement whereby Mr Robert M. Sobukwe, of care of Officer Commanding, Robben Island Gaol, Robben Island, Cape Town, would be able to purchase his clothing and other requirements from your Cape Town shop, with the amounts being charged to me.

I have today received a letter from Mr Sobukwe, written on Pebruary 5, in which he says that he had placed an order for some goods but had not yet received them. I believe that the order was placed sometime in December.

Because of the delay in his letter reaching me it is possible that his order has already been attended to. But in case it has not, I thought that I should write to you again in order to get the situation clarified.

As previously advised, I have an account with your company in Johannesburg, and Mr Sobukwe's purchases can be charged to me. You have my authority to supply him with whatever he may request.
