The most important of these at present are the questions of finding suitable employ most (and this is being gone into) and furnishing his now home. For this to be adequately done will cost anything up to R1,000, and any amount which could be made available towards this would be tremendously useful. The immediate targets are the purchases of a lounge suite, bodroom suite, refrigerator, stove, linen, carpets, etc.

An I may, I trust that you will not mind writing to you about those dotails. I thought that it might also be of some assistance to you.
