I now proceed to quote relevant passages in the statements of Natives in South West Africa itself and I hope that the reasons for their opposition will be taken careful note of because they are more fundamental in the whole question of the Administration of South West Africa since the territory was taken from the Germans and through the whole period of the mandate to date.

These letters and communications I list below, were sent to the writer as ^President General of the African National Congress in the Union of South Africa. The aims and objects of My Congress are:-

- (a) To protect and advance the interests of the African peoples in all matters affecting them.
- (b) To attain the freedom of all African people from all discriminatory laws whatsoever.
- (c) To strive and work for their complete freedom and their full participation in the Government of South Africa.

Here is a letter asking me to assist and giving me a mandate to act on their behalf.

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
