1. We, my mother my daughter and two babies, were asleep when we heard a noise outside. It was about 10,30 p.m. and on looking we saw a group of men outside.
2. These men had IFF t-shirts on and striped headbands.
3. They started breaking doors and windows and then they broke our door down. Five of the men then came into the house.
4. Once they were in the house they started breaking things in the dining room, I could hear them from the bedroom.
5. They came into the bedroom and the one leading the group stabbed me three times with an assagai. I was trying to hide under the bed where I had pushed my three year old son.
6. As he stabbed me he shouted in Zulu, "These dogs must be killed".
7. The others grabbed my mother and started stabbing her with spears.
8. The one stabbing me stopped and went for my daughter.
9. The other four were leaving and called for the one stabbing my daughter who was saying "this dog must die".
10. After satisfying himself that my daughter was dead he left. My daughter is survived by her 2 month old baby. She was lying on the baby so as not to allow them to stab the child.
11. All this took place in the dark and it seemed that the men were feeling to see who they could stab.
12. I was taken to the hospital and did not see any police until I returned. My mother, who is 89 year old, is still in hospital.
13. The ambulances only came after about 1 hour. I believe my daughter's life could have been saved if they had come sooner as she was alive after the attackers had left her for dead.

Op die oggend van 1992-06-18 om ongeveer 06:45 terwyl op pad werk toe, het ek 'n radio rapport gemonitor en verneem dat elf (11) lyke gevind is. Ek het ook 'n berig gemonitor dat mense klippe gooi na motoriste te Dongesstraat Vanderbijlpark. Ek het onmiddelik na Dongesstraat beweeg waar ek gevind het dat motors baie beskadig was. Ek het ook dadelik na die Vanderbijlpark Polisiestasie gegaan waar lede van die publiek klagtes van saakbeskadiging aanhandig gemaak het. Ek het hierna na Boipatong beweeg (westekant) waar ek weermag voertuie asook Casspirs gevind het. Hulle was besig met patrolliedienste.
