Dear Mrs Taylor,

Thank you wary much indeed for your letter of October 13 which reached me on Friday. I am just about to write to Bob, and will be delighted to send on your letter.

The book you sent also arrived on Friday. By a happy coincidence, I was making up parcels of books for him on that day so your book was posped immediately. I think it is an excellent encice and will be much appreciated by him — provided, of course, that the authorities allow it through to him. In his last letter to me he sequested plays by Priestley, stories by Maugham, studies in Judaism and anything political I could get to him. I organized a cutek whip round among people I know and was able to send him about 29 books on a range of subjects.

I have previously written to Beb Bilheimer saking his to convey my personal thanks to you for your continued kindness and generosity. I am happy to have this change to write direct to you to say the same thing. You will have seen from the letters received by you the calibre of the man with whom we are dealing. I am only add to this that your kindness is making life a great deal easier for him for his wife and for his children. I have just finalised arrangements for his wife and four children to travel to dape form at the end of December to pay a visit to him, and have also arranged for the children to return home first from boarding school. Also, within the next few weeks I shall be arranging for a lass food pursel to be send to him.

All this would have been deposible without your help. My very grateful thanks to you.
