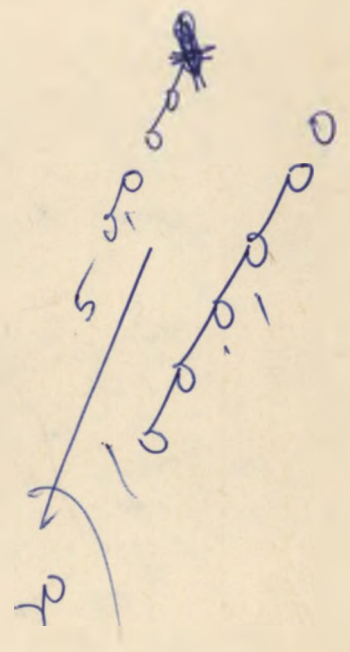
GRANTS-IN-AID 1960/61 : NON-EUROPEAN AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT.
