#### Dear Mr. Buthelezi,

In the absence of Dr. Beyers Naudé, currently on vacation in the Western Cape, I would acknowledge with thanks your letter of the 1st of February, 1973. You apply on behalf of the National Executive of the Black Peoples' Convention for office accommodation in Pharmacy House, Braamfontein,

At present the Christian Institute is awaiting advice concerning the right of Black bodies to use offices in Pharmacy House which are zoned as "White" under the Group Areas Act. The South African Student Organisation having been told to vacate their office in Pharmacy House, the Christian Institute has made application to the authorities for an exemption b be granted of Section 26, Act 36, of 1966 (the Group Areas Act).

Both Dr. Naudé and I are desirous of making accommodation available if at all possible. Our dilemma is that at the present time uncertainty prevails regarding the right of Black organisations like your own to have offices in the Braamfontein area. We can but await the outcome of our application.

Finally may I assure you that your needs have been presented to co-trustees, namely the South African Council of Churches, Anglican, and Lutheran, who together with us administer the building known as Pharmacy House. At present we are simply not able to provide any further accommodation as these other bodies that I have mentioned have by virtue of their being part-owners the right of first occupation as offices become available. We shall keep you informed as to developments.
