TRAINING OF PHARMACISTS.

Your letter dated 13th November, 1952 has been referred to me for attention and I have pleasure in replying to it. The arrangements for the training of Non-European pharmacists are at the moment not yet complete.

The position is that it is necessary for any students who wish to qualify as pharmacists, to have both practical and theoretical training, and at present the facilities for this training are not yet available, owing to certain difficulties, but arrangements are being made for these difficulties to be removed although I cannot say when this will be.

I suggest you get in touch with the Institute's Regional representative Mr. Maurice Webb, Colonisation Chambers, West Street, Durban. He will be in a position to give you any advice you may seek in this matter.
