In the beginning the Malaza clan were living at Luhleko under the Maseko chief. The head of the Malaza clan when Somblolo came was Shelewa Malaza. The Malaza people moved from Luhleko to Motshane near present day Mbabane. This time they were under Shelewa's son, Bhekani. At Motshane they settled at EKugacweni, at Chief Londundulu Nkhosi's royal residence. Today ki however the Malaza clan is scattered here and there around the country of the Swazi. At Luhleko the Malazaza, together with the Maseko were known as the Emangqamane (the Ngqamane). Other clans found at Luhleko at this time were Mbhokane (Gama) and Ngozo. All these people were under the Maseko.

Like other Swazi people the Malaza were incorporated into the Swazi regiments. They frequently went to the xxxxxx royal homestead.

The Malaza surname is thus:- Malaza, NaboNkhosi, Nabofodvulubovu, Nabondzab' uvakalako, yeviwa ngu Mshengu waShabalala, yathsi isesangweni yaphangalala, Ngqamane, Mbulunga lomuhle....

Previously the Malaza people married did not marry the Maseko, Ngozo, Mbhokane, but now this does not apply.

When the Malaza people came to Mothsane they were under Shelewa's son, Bhekani. Bhekani is famous for making hoes. After Bhekani, Mahlanya (his grandson) became the important man in the Malaza xxx clan. Mahlanya begot Shizela, who begot Mavaha, who disappeared from home and never came back.
