- 24 March Palm Sunday by the Procession; All glory, laud, & honour was sung. Sr A. Thurifer, Sr M. C. Crucifer, on returning to Chapel the Chaplain went to the Chapel of Penitence, & changed the Cope for the Charubls; at the end of the hymn. Ride on. Ride on. was sung without any pause, & Mass followed straight on without any break. Incense was used but not at the reading of the Passion. Other services as usual. Nocturns were said directly after Compline.
- 25 " Monday. Matins were said after breakfast, with the intention of saying <sup>it</sup> every day, but <sup>it</sup> had to be discontinued owing to the lateness of Mass. Evensong at 6.30. This week with a short address. Nocturns were said each evening.
- 26 Tuesday Rita & Frances made their General Confession
- 27 Wed Anna made her General Confession
- 28 Maundy Thursday Sung Mass with incense.

- 28 March Maundy Thursday. Directly after Mass the Chaplain washed the High altar. S. L. M. & S. M. C. stripped the altar & waited on the Chaplain. The Cross & vases of flowers, were left on the altar & the candles kept lighted. The Sisters repeated the antiphons during the washing.
- 29 " Good Friday Services as usual.
- 30 Holy Saturday. Lauds & Prime at 7.0. Matins & Anti Communion at 7.30. Evensong at 3.15. Directly afterwards the Mass Sanctus song & incense boat given by the Chaplain ~~was~~ <sup>was</sup> Blessed. The Chaplain heard confessions all the morning & after Evensong. 1<sup>st</sup> Vespers of Easter Day at 7.0. <sup>Rite</sup> ~~May~~ Dismissed at Evensong.
- 31<sup>st</sup> Easter Day. Sung Mass with incense at 7.0. Plain Mass with hymns at 8.0. Solemn Evensong, with short sermon, & Procession at 6.15
