The Bishop then led the Mother Provincial preceded by the Chaplain carrying the Proc: Cross to her stall where he placed her & gave her his blessing. He then returned to the Altar with the Chaplain & Mass was proceeded with. The Mother Prov., S^r Alice ^{the Asst} Superior Elect, S^r M. Christopher, S^r Annette & S^r Suid Communicated - When the service was over all but the C.S.M.V Sisters left the Chapel.
