At the historic Congress of the People, in Kliptown, the elected delegates of the people adopted the <u>FREEDOM CHARTER</u> which was drawn-up from the thousands of demands sent in by people from all walks of life throughout the country.

The FREEDOM CHARTER is a great document but it can only become a force if we strive for the realisation of its ideals, hence the "1,000,000 Signature Campaign" for its popularisation by June,1956. The Transvaal have been given the quota of 450,000 signatures, of which the Transvaal Indian Congress have to collect 10,000 signatures by the 31st December,1955.

In order to make it the guiding star of all who cherish freedom, the Charter must become a <u>dynamic political force</u> which the Nationalists will have to reckon with. Like the American "Declaration of Independence" the Charter must become part of the people; it must be on the lips of all who love Peace and Liberty. This could be achieved by having it explained and signed by the people.

The Youth Congress offers the following prize to all Indian Youth (males and females) who will collect one thousand Indian signatures for the Freedom Charter by the 16th December,1955.


