Financier as we may call him  
delivered the first ~~prize~~ prize being a  
silver lamp presented to the Westphal  
by the Choir members. Another song  
followed. and two poetries one in Dutch  
the other in English recited by Mr E.  
Cooke & Maria Kats.  
The Great Hallelujah was  
then sung Rebolang brought forward  
the 2<sup>nd</sup> prize being a Bible presented  
to the Rev. by the school children.  
Finally the last song "God of met  
n?" was sung & we dismissed.
