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The egreement entered into between the Mative Affairs Got Dept. and the Youn Council of Pietersburg on the above montioned question as a result of the investigationd made by Meesrs J. Mohid Joung and F.C. Candwell during April 1941 was made without consulting property owners of New Pictorsburg . The New Pictorsburg committee was invited by the above gentlemen to a meeting in the Native GmoCommissioner's office during that period , and at that meeting Mr Joung told the commissee that the agreement concerned was to protect the interest of Native that the appocnent concerned was to protect the interest of Mative purchasers who did not have transfers and who from Mr Van Miekerk . Further that Matives who bought plots from other sellers were not affected Mr Emmett the then Mative Counissioner also summened a meeting of the property owners of New Fleteraburg at New Fleteraburg at a later date and also assured them that the agreement did not affect buyers who had transfers and who bought plots from other sellers other than Mr Van Miek Mickork whose insolvency had placed purchasers of his plots and the majority of whom did not have transfers in a precarbous position . The counities has learned with great astanishment from Mr 4.4. Supton the committee has learned with great astonialment from Mr A.J. Turton the Inspector of Orban Locations representing the Covermont at a meeting held in the Native Commissioner's office on the 10th January 1844 that the expropriation of plots will include all purchasers outside the the expropriation of plots will include all purchasters outside the proposed recorved area , and Matives who can plots inside the reserved area measuring more than 57ft X looft and 57ft by 12oft will also be expropriated . He further stated that all buyers who have more than one plot outside the reserved area will be deprived of the plots for which be they he will get compensation and for the remaining plot he will get a plot in the reserved and also that those in the reserved area who can more than one plot the same will apply to them : and further that Matives who can plots measuring more than 57ft X looft will also be expopriated .

The town Council of Fietersburg did not at any time consult the property owners on its intentions . Mr Turton gave two reasons to the counities why the Town Council wishes to devide New Fistersburg into residential ned non residential eress , nemely :-(1) That the Town Council would be unable to render services as New

Fleteraburg measures 216 morgan in extent . (2) That the Council wishes to protect three quarters of Satus Mative Furchasers who can small plots measuring 103ft % 55ft and 12oft % 55ft

in the reserved area . These reasons were given by the form Council according to Mr Turton's explanation in asking the South African Wative Trust to advance mony for the expropriation of the plots concerned .

In ensurer to the above reasons the conmittee submits as follows :-(1) The property owners of New Fiteraburg pay rates to the Municipality which must enable them to render services . The bigger the Township the more rates the Municipality will get and enough for services .

(2) ar furton informed the coumittee on that day that the dept of Health has fixed as minimum Soft xSoft for plots . So the question of protecting three quarters of the purchasers in the reserved area must fall every because they all our plots measuring at least loSftx 55 .

In conclusion we have under register the following protests :-

(1) The agreement entered between the mulcipality of Pietersburg and the Mative Affairs Dept . to which Mr Heald's report of the 15th Dec. 1941 makes several references was made without consulting the property owners and the details of this agreement are up to now unknown by the seld property owners .

(2) The property owners of New Pietersburg are strongly opposed to the division of New Pietersburg into a residential and a non residential area proposed by Heald's report, and they feel that this agreement affects their rights of ownership which they aguired long befor the agreement. They further wish to point out that the Native Affairs Commission led by the late Dr Roberts in 1932, on the resonmendation of the then Yown Council of Pietersburg, and the Joint Council of Europeans and Natives, approved that New Pietersburg be a Native Super-Township : and it is felt by the property owners that this egreement approval be upheld.

(4) The property owners are strongly opposed to the question of expropriation as contemplated by the Municipality of Pistersburg . They wish further more to point that the reason why there 80 not so many houses in the so called non residential area is that for the last four years the Municipali ty has been refusing to allow property owners to erect new buildings .

(5) The property owners, therefore, humbly request the Government to withdrew the Proclamation whereby New Pictersburg was placed under Section 5 of Act 21 of 1923 as amended and reiterate their previous request that New Picterbur be recognized a Native Township.

(6) Finally the committee strongly objects to the S.N.T. advancing money to the Town Council of Fietersburg for the sole purpose of expropriating property owners at New Fieterbaurg as the S.A. was 60% created for the par prupose of catering for the welfare of Native people.
