Dear Miss Horrell, National Council of African Women: Annual Meeting

Returning last night from Graaff Reinet where the ahove meeting was held in the Methodist Church Hall in the location, I hasten again to thank you, both on my own behalf and that of the National Council of African Women, for your very kind assistance in making possible the lecture on "The Legal Status of African Women" which the Council so ardently desired.

In delivering the script with which you so kindly provided me, I gave a clear statement of its origin and concluded by expressing the gratitude of my audience and myself for the very valuable information which it gave. I must confess that we were all rather stupefied by the complexity of the matter but the subsequent discussion lasted for a full hour. Your suggestion that Study Groups should be formed seemed more acceptable to the convocation than a proposal thrown out by me that the Government be asked to appoint a commission to investigate the Legal Disabilities of African Women in a manner similar to the previous one dealing with White Women. The president, Mrs Mesedi, stated that if the Council seemed diffident in accepting either, itndid not mean that they were timorous but rather that they were cautious. In fact, owing to the typically vague manner of African women, I was unable at the end to determine what they had decided to do. It is possible that at the conclusion of the Conference on the I9th December (I was unable to stay for its full course), they may formulate a resolution.

We were all very regretful that you could not yourself be there but I must ask you to accept my assurance that your kind assistance was very greatly appreciated and by no one more so than me.
