CONFERENCE THE ON WESTERN AREAS REMOVAL SCHEME.

The Southern Transvaal Regional Committee of the S.A. Institute of Race Relations is convening an all-day Conference on the Western Areas Removal Scheme on Saturday, 22nd August, 1953, at the University of the Witwatersrand (Room 142), Milner Park, at 9.30 a.m. The Right Rev. Bishop Ambrose Reeves. Bishop of Johannesburg, has kindly accepted the Chairmanship.

The proposals regarding the Western Areas are of great significance to Johannesburg. They affect not only the Non-Europeans who live in these areas, but all citizens. The object of the Conference is to consider the facts of the situation, the details of the proposals that have been made and their implications. It is considered vitally necessary that the public should be informed upon this ussue, and that a considered public attitude is formulated.

Dear Mr. Carlile,

Cur Secretary has passed your letter of 19th May on to me in connection with your query regarding the future of the Western Hative Township.

The position is that the Western Native Township is not included in the removal scheme which is at present being undertaken in regard to the other "western areas". The Native Resattlement Bill which will no doubt be an Act soon will, however, give the Minister of Native Affairs the power to remove any Native location or township and it is, therefore, difficult to say whether the Western Native Township will be allowed to remain a Native township indefinitely. It is of interest that the Mentz Commission has recommended the removal of the Western Native Township elso, and that that township should be turned into an area for Coloured residence. We understand that the future of the whole "western area", including the Western Native Township, will be decided by the Land Tenure Board in terms of the Group Areas Act. No decision has, however, been made thus far by the Land Tenure Board.
