for the Home, returning at 7.16.

Friday 10th

7.15. Mass. ^{Requiem} Mother - S.A.R. went
to town by van for chopping. ^{oculist.} Mother
went on to the D.S.G. & stayed there
until after tea when S. Maynie
S. J. E. came in the car, after
chopping, to fetch her a S.C.T. -
Miss Abbott Smith.

S. Grace & B. Stempfortin came
at 7.16 p.m. for the Retreat.

Saturday
12th

Two Leani's funeral was at 3 p.m.
She died the previous day - her
relatives were anxious to have the
first part of the funeral in the
Chapel. Large congregation,
mostly men. S.A.R. S. Revie -
S. Rosemary helped & went to the
Cemetery also. Fr. Taylor officiated.
The Leani's were most grateful.

Sat: 12th

7.15 Mass. of our Lady. The
Tabernacle ^{only} curtain was made
the Tabernacle covered down.
Miss Abbott Smith Miss O'Toole

left after an early lunch -
Still showing but some sunshine.
Mrs Sanders called, also Marie
Dreyden (née Leen). The latter came to
see S. René while her father called
a Fr. Taylor.

Sunday, July 11.. 7.30 Sung Mass. This Sabbath
July 12. Miss Baines came out at 10.0^c

for a short visit returning
at 4.0^c. Fr. Taylor used some
of her pictures at Evensong.

Mon: 13th.

7.15 Mass. Sisters all came for
Retreat including S. Rachel &
S. Mildred of E. Grinstead.

S. Smyllor & S. Grace of K' (Antonia)
went in by van. The latter returned
in the evening with the D. S. G. P. Sister
with whom she had spent the
day. S. Margie took the car
into the garage to be mended &
have tyres changed.

Usual Retreat arrangements
& beds in Trust, Guidance &
& legues.

Tue. 14th.

7.30 Mass - Retreat timetable
held day after heavy rain in
the night. Mrs Day came over
from Bobsburg in the morning
with clothes & a cot.

Mr Ellis & Mr Frost the builder
came in the afternoon & got
the contract signed & viewed
the site & settled various
details. Mrs Nixon came &

Took a charge. Mr Cooke did not help this year, having gone to look after S.G.C. being out of Retreat.

Wed 15th
& Swithun

7.30 Mass. Retreat timetable.
Last day. Lovely soft day - damp with some sunshine.

Thurs 16th

7.30 Mass. Retreat as usual.
Mother's anniversary & her arrival happily kept - lovely flowers etc. & some festivities between her, S.G.C. & S. Swoyld.

We found the builders arrived with long-load of scaffolding etc. & the cutting-down of the big gum trees began.

Engine went wrong but was put right before evening. Lovely day

Fri 17th

7.30 Mass. Last day of the Retreat.

Big gum tree taken down (the other one prepared). Colder but lovely sunny day. Miss Bollen came to see Mother had dinner here.

Sat 18th

7.30 Mass. Retreat ended.

D. & G. Sisters went after dinner, except S. Isidore & S. Eudora who stayed over the bank end. S. Grace of Bloemfontein - S. Mildred of E. Grinstead left at 10 o.c.

Tree charring of the site continued. Mrs Cullinan called & interviewed & suggested Miss Macintosh. The engine bathyspheris flamed up - a light kindled. Mrs. J. Claude today that the bad roads had caused the 7.30 train to miss the train so she could not arrive until

Sunday. 19th
Trinity VIII

Wednesday. S.A.R. rather poor
S. H. drove to Roseway for Nat. Hist. case at Pine den
7.30 Mass. 11 towns
folks came. S. Yaspie having
gone down to provide motor
transport. Several came to
Excursion but not the number
expected.

Mr S. Cullinan came to
fetch Miss Macbeth soon after
breakfast. Mon: Bourgeois -
Miss Bonnard called after tea.
S.A.R. rather better.

Engine was attended to by the

Stossle called in the morning &
brought an alb. to be altered.

Miss Trolley came to stay.
Much digging of foundation for
the new room. Mr van der Byl
the engineer called about the
electric light.
P. Maynie took S. Euid & some
children to town in the car - in

the afternoon S. Eid went to Rietpatein
with a child (Margaret) from S. Agati's
Solema Evensong of S. Mary Magdalen

Wed: 22nd

S. M. Tazd:

7.15 Mass. Sing. Miss Wollaston
went away. S. Claudia arrived
from S. Culbert's in the evening.
Father Taylor spent the day in
Protoni & visited the S.S.G. The
sagine magnets went wrong &
very little light in the evening
after Summers came back with
the mended magnets.

No Evensong, but several
admissions & dismissals of girls.

Thurs. 23rd

7.15 Mass.
Baptism of two babies at 11.0
(Mary Elizabeth & Ockert Jacobus).
S. A. R. & S. M. went to S. London
in the evening.

Friday 24th

7.15 Mass. Requiem for Fr. Taylor's
sister. 8.0 Mass of the Vigil
in the little Chapel said by
Father Wre C.R. with some congrega-
tion from the house & some from
the Township.

Mr Ransome & two friends (Misses
Pilliers) came & saw the Home in
the morning. Joyce Gradwell's
baby was born (Colleen) & privately
baptized by S. Rosemary.

The brickwork of the Rec: Room wall
was begun.
