I am so sorry we cannot discuss this personally. I hate writing letters as they take time too.

I must dash now to a meeting. Please let me have the details I ask and your answers to the other points.

I presume the reason you do not just hand over all the money you can get to the S. is that you yourself are being wise & wanting to know on what the money is spent.

Otherwise the easiest way for everybody would just be to give her a monthly or regular sum direct & let her attend to her own needs.

If you were overseas you could certainly do that by remitting the money direct to her. Love & sympathy
