A restriction of such a nature limits the students in their contacts with other - the psychological effect is bad.

The more is one to be deplored. Friction is essential in the educational world. Students from different parts of the country. This wider contact is itself an important part of education.

From previous experience at Heidelberg, the loss will be serious. Bochnans & Bosulas regard Europeans not as friends but as traditional enemies. He former especially are generally on the side of authority, & thus set a good example to students from the Union.

We have insufficient accommodation for demand from local districts

When accommodation is available without inconvenience to Union students, native-Union students should be accepted. If the difficulty is financial, the natives could be called upon to pay a part.

Can will retard the growth of the school. The local feeder schools have never had more than 50 to 60 boys, & we could draw on the Beaufortland Protectorate to make up for the poor supply from our local schools.

The number of non-Union students has never upset our educational system. It would seem that the decision is on political grounds. The Govt is aiming at a "white" Africa with SA on the pivot & pattern. Non-Union Africans admitted here would learn some of the "secrets" of the Union's native policy which the Union wishes other countries to adopt & copy without too much opposition from their people.

It is wrong to so divide the Bantu of SA in educational matters for political reasons.

The policy of excluding the non-Union students is certainly a narrow one. African students should be able to develop a wider outlook by meeting others from outside the Union in educational institutions.
