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## GERMANS FLING MASSES OF MEN AT SEVASTOPOL

### STEADY ADVANCE BY RED ARMY IN THE LENINGRAD AREA

THE CORRESPONDENT OF "THE TIMES" ON THE GERMAN FRONTIER CABLED ON TUESDAY THAT THE GERMAN FORCES IN THE CRIMEA AGGREGATE NO FEWER THAN THREE ARMoured DIVISIONS, NINE INFANTRY DIVISIONS, AND TWO BRIGADES OF CAVALRY, THE WHOLE BEING CEASELESSLY HURLED WAVE AFTER WAVE AGAINST SEVASTOPOL.

#### RUSSIANS PREPARED

GERMAN REPORTS ASSERT—AND THE RUSSIANS DO NOT DENY IT—that the evacuation of Sevastopol by sea is going on as well, as the murderous dive-bombing permits. The losses of Russian shipping being unavoidable. That the Russians themselves reckoned on the possible fall of Kerch was indicated by strenuous Russian efforts on the eastern side of the narrow straits dividing Kerch from the mainland with the object of blocking any German landing and preventing an advance along the Kurbang River.

#### GERMANS HELD

NOWHERE ELSE THROUGHOUT THE FRONT LINE, HOWEVER, HAVE THE GERMANS ACHIEVED ANY SUCCESS. FRONTAL ATTACKS ON LENINGRAD AND MOSCOW HAVE PROVOKED THE MOST STUBBORN RUSSIAN COUNTER-ATTACKS, THE UPSHOT BEING NO ADVANCE BY EITHER SIDE. THE GERMAN EFFORTS TO WORK ROUND MOSCOW PRECIPITATED FIERCE FIGHTING BOTH AT KALININ, WHERE THE GERMANS WERE THROWN BACK, AND AT TULA, WHERE THE RUSSIANS CAPTURED ALTOGETHER 21 VILLAGES AND ARE NOW MASSING MORE RESERVES TO FOLLOW UP THE SUCCESSES.

### Red Army Advances

A steady advance by the Red Army in the Leningrad area and a German defeat at Tula are reported in Sapa-Reuter messages from Moscow.

The Tass news agency says that having dislodged the Germans from positions before Leningrad which they held for more than two months, Soviet forces are steadily advancing along the left bank of the river Neva—presumably the Neva.

The Russians, "overcoming strong enemy fortifications and intensive gunfire, and taking by storm every foot of ground, are pressing the Fascists back," says the agency.

Soviet bombers and low-flying attack planes, co-operating with

artillery, have smashed and silenced enemy firing positions, clearing the way for the infantry. Repeated German counter-attacks to regain lost positions have failed, and the Soviet troops have captured material and inflicted many casualties.

Reporting a German defeat at Tula, a correspondent of the newspaper, Red Star, says "The ground abandoned by the Germans on the southern outskirts of Tula is strewn with evidence of the panic in which they fled. Clothing, arms, ammunition, guns, tanks and even cigarettes were left behind in great confusion. The German positions had been held by three regiments which had been preparing to take Tula by storm—but they waited too long."

### U. S. Ships To Britain To Be Armed First

Colonel Frank Knox, Secretary for the Navy, announced to-day that ships plying to and from Britain and "northern Europe" would be the first American merchantmen to be armed.

Second priority would be given to ships going to the Red Sea, and third to ships for the South Atlantic.

This announcement was the first official Navy statement on the plans for arming ships.

Colonel Knox did not say when the arming would start, but other authorities predict that it will begin this week.



### Spitfires over France

Spitfires on one operation over northern France on Sunday left a trail of wreckage behind them. In one case the target, a brick building on the side of a railway, was left burning after only one attack. Black and white smoke poured from it.

This building was situated in a small town in the Cherbourg peninsula, and troops who were in the town square scattered in all directions during the Spitfire's attack.

In another case the target, which had a large chimney on one side, was shot up from ground level. The chimney and top window of the building were seen to be hit, and the building immediately burst into flames.

### Representative Council Meets At Pretoria On Monday

THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL WILL BE OPENED BY THE MINISTER OF NATIVE AFFAIRS, COLONEL DENEYS REITZ, ON MONDAY NOVEMBER 24 IN THE CITY HALL, PRETORIA.

THE AGENDA IS LONG AND CONTAINS MATTERS OF NATIONAL IMPORTANCE FOR DISCUSSION, SUCH AS EDUCATION, LAND, THE POSITION OF CHIEFS, AGRICULTURAL MATTERS, URBAN CONDITIONS OF AFRICANS, WAGES, RECOGNITION OF TRADE UNIONS, FARM LABOUR AND MANY OTHER MATTERS.

The Council will also deal with a Bill amending the Native Administration Act, regulations dealing with administration of anaesthetics to African juveniles, sale of native medicine through the post, recovery of rates and fees due, local councils and control of circumcision schools.

To give the readers of "The Bantu World" an idea of the importance of some of the motions submitted by members of the Council, it will be necessary to quote few of these motions, particularly those dealing with education, land, chiefs, farm labour and urban conditions.

One of the motions on education inter alia says: "The Council holds strongly that the present method of financing the education of the African children is not only wholly inadequate to meet the needs, but is equally unjust of a people who contribute more than their share to the national incomes through indirect taxation, labour and wages."

The council, therefore, determinedly presses the Government to finance the education of the African children upon the same principle as they finance the education of European, Coloured and Asiatic children."

The question of land which is a burning one is dealt with in a series of motions, one of which draws the attention of Parliament to the profound disappointment of the tribes and chiefs that they cannot acquire land in released areas but that the South African Native Trust is buying the land and compelling tribesmen to pay rent in perpetuity.

### News In Brief

#### IRAQ

The Government of Iraq has decided to break off relations with the Government of Japan and the Vichy Government. The role played by the representatives of the two Governments in Baghdad during the Rashid Ali rising is officially given as the reason for the break.

#### RUSSIA

German troops are suffering severely from cold on the central sector of the Russo front, according to information reaching London. Very few of the troops are equipped for a winter campaign, and a number have been found frozen to death. Many were wearing women's fur coats and other makeshift garments. On the other hand Russian troops are well equipped.

#### JAPAN

As British and American Naval units assemble in the Far East, Japanese land and air forces concentrated in Northern Indo-China are reported, according to the diplomatic correspondent of the "Daily Telegraph," to be moving south and west-towards the frontier of Siam.

Reports reaching London from Siam reflect anxiety. This will not be relieved by an incident reported from Bangkok. After 40 Vichy French gendarmes had violated the frontier there was an exchange of shots. Four Siamese police were wounded and one Indo-Chinese gendarme was killed and captured.

#### GERMANY

The Germans, says the correspondent of "The Times" in Stockholm, now recognise as a fact that all these countries possess minorities who are hostile or negatively disposed and who believe that they already see a swing over in the balance of force in the war and are, therefore, adopting an attitude sympathetic to Britain and United States. The German authorities describe as a sign of the times the existence in these countries of "certain hostile critics of Axis powers who believe they can predict the collapse of the Axis through internal difficulties."



## Non-European Hospital

Once again light has been focussed on the terrible conditions obtaining at the non-European Hospital as a result of over-crowding and acute shortage of staff. A painful incident has served to call the urgent attention of the authorities to these conditions.

Some months ago, says a report in The Star, a mother of two little children was brought to the hospital for a tonsils operation, which was successful. She was taken back to the ward, which had 48 beds and about 80 patients. The overflow was accommodated on mattresses on the floor along the passage-ways. There was only one qualified European nurse, assisted by a European probationer and five African probationers. This sister was busy with several serious cases but was not alarmed about the woman, having detailed two African probationers to look after her.

The woman died of asphyxia during unconsciousness. At the inquest an honorary surgeon told the magistrate that he believed that the patient would not have lost her life had there been sufficient qualified European nurses to give her the necessary attention.

The magistrate said that the death could be ascribed to the over-crowding and lack of nursing staff at the hospital, and described the congestion there as "disgraceful."

This is a terrible indictment against a city of the size of Johannesburg with a population of Non-Europeans of over 200,000. And the bulk of this population which consists of Africans has only just learnt to be "hospital conscious."

A few years back it almost broke the hearts of the authorities trying to convince the Africans that the hospitals were the proper and safest places in which they should come for medical aid. At the time the Africans had no faith in hospitals. They were misled by those of their people who were still under the influence of witch-doctors. These gave them the impression that once an African went to hospital, he was as good as dead.

Indeed they went to the extent of saying a difficult case at the hospital was just "removed" by doctors who soon got fed up of doctoring a person who did not seem to benefit from their ministrations. These callous rumours kept many Africans away from hospital and as a result many lost their lives. It is, therefore, greatly to be deplored that after the authorities have won this war of ignorance and superstition they are now allowing such distressing state of affairs to obtain at the Non-European hospital.

The fact that it has been openly published in the daily press that an African woman lost her life as a result of over-crowding and acute staff shortage, and that people lie on floors to make room for others, will upset the minds of the Africans who were beginning to look to the hospital with faith and trust. Their faith will be shattered.

Perhaps at the time when the authorities were trying to convince them about the good the hospitals could do for them, they did not visualise that the response—once awokened would be like an avalanche. They were thus unprepared for the remarkable faith the Africans soon had on the treatment given at the hospitals.

Will this faith be allowed to die just because those in authority cannot see their way to meeting these conditions as soon as possible?

At the time of writing we learnt that as a result of the publicity which has been given to this matter a deputation from the Johannesburg City Council was meeting the Provincial Secretary, Mr. H. F. Pentz at the Johannesburg General Hospital.

What the outcome of the deputation will be we are not in a position to know; but we do not doubt that something tangible will result and that this may lead to more practical remedy being applied on this problem.

## African Health Services

The Minister of Health, Mr. Lawrence, announced on Friday that he had appointed a committee to consider the position as it had developed in regard to the scheme for the training of Native medical aids and any modification it might be necessary to make in that scheme. The committee would also consider the development of the scheme for the training of Natives for degrees in medicine and the effect of that scheme on general medical services for Natives.

The committee consisted of the Secretary for Native Affairs (chairman), the Secretary for Public Health, the Secretary for Education, Professor R. A. Dart (representing the University of the Witwatersrand) and Dr. C. J. Albertyn (representing the South African Medical Association), with Dr. G. W. Gale, Assistant Health Officer of the Department of Public Health as secretary. The committee would pursue its inquiries in December at Fort Hare, Durban and Pretoria.

Mr. Lawrence also spoke of the Public Health Department's health propaganda proposals and the Government's intention to explore a State medical scheme.

The occasion was the opening of new wards and a nurses' home at the Donald Fraser Hospital at Sibasa, northern Transvaal. In August, 1934, Mr. J. H. Hofmeyr opened a small hospital of 12 beds at Sibasa and the present extensions will increase the accommodation to 60 beds.

Mr. Lawrence said they remembered with thankfulness the name of Donald Fraser, who was one of the most outstanding Scottish missionaries to Africa in the present century. During a visit to the Union in 1925-26 he became greatly concerned at the very evident need for medical work in the Native reserves, and his representations to the Foreign Mission Committee of the Church of Scotland resulted in a generous donation being received to establish a number of medical missions in South Africa. As a result, three hospitals were established, one in the Transkei, one in Natal, and the third at Sibasa, which was opened shortly after Dr. Fraser's death.

For 18 months patients were accommodated in a few small huts hurriedly built by some of the local chiefs, but by August, 1934, the old Mission House had been converted into two small wards with 12 beds. Within the first five years the number of admissions to the hospital rose from 94 to 230 and outpatient attendance from 3,380 to 16,020. In 1940 the patients numbered more than 500, with a daily average of 39.

The total cost of building the hospital including superintendent's house, staff quarters and the nurses' home was approximately £8,000. This was a remarkably low figure when it was remembered that some public hospitals recently built in South Africa had

## THE READERS' FORUM

### AFRICAN TEACHERS SHOULD BE ON THE REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL

Sir,

In an old fable a frog was drowned in a tub of milk. It started kicking about, making the best of its predicament until the cream was churned into a lump of butter, and thus the frog began to float.

At the most critical hour in the whole history of African political organisation our leaders, or rather, leader, accepted the well-known **compromise**, in defiance of, and against the **will of the people**. Thus to-day we have the Native Representative Council. It would be fruitless now to cry over spilt milk, the best and only sensible thing to do now is to make the best of "a bad job." Motivated by this idea I boldly suggest that the Native Teachers' Federation, consisting of African teachers of the four Provinces, should boldly make representations to the powers that be with a view to securing a representative on the N.R.C. during next year's elections.

My reasons for the suggestion are—

- (a) The teachers are still largely the only enlightened section of the African community.
- (b) In the past teachers have played no mean role in the leadership of their people; the supposed greatest leader of the day is a teacher.
- (c) It is unfair to deny the community the services of its most enlightened group in a life and death struggle for rights, especially as teachers are not even regarded as civil servants

by the Government.

(d) The N.R.C. is not a political body, but an Advisory Board, and teachers who became councillors would not thereby have entered the arena of party political feuds.

(e) Apart from the fact that educational matters in general loom large in the activities of Africans in the evidence of most deponents before the Government Commission in Johannesburg recently.

(f) If students of the Universities of London and Oxford respectively, return Parliamentary representatives, why should African teachers be content to occupy the "Cinderella position" in so important a cause?

## Red Cross Society

It is sometimes asked by Natives: "Why should we give our money to help the Red Cross Society? They only look after the white people."

The best way of disproving this statement, and of showing that Red Cross does its best to help white and coloured alike without displaying any favouritism, is to quote extracts from two letters received by the Society during the month.

One was from a white corporal who found himself in the Standerton Hospital after being involved in an army convoy motor smash. He says:

"I should like to explain that I was merely passing through Standerton when I was injured, and so found myself a complete stranger in the hospital. This condition was very soon changed by the overwhelming kindness of your representatives, to whom nothing was too much trouble, and whose weekly gifts of those necessities, comforts and fruit, so welcome in a hospital, were more appreciated than I can describe.

"A leg injury prevented me from walking unaided and the hospital could supply neither stick nor crutches. A Red Cross representative at once undertook to procure a suitable stick for me through the Society, and I have used the stick ever since and am likely to use it for some time to come."

The second letter was received from a Native officer of the King's African Rifles, who was sent down from Nairobi to the Union for eye operation and treatment. He says: "The Superintendent of the Hospital, the Matron and all the staff here, European and African nurses, have been extremely kind."

## Household Hints

### Cubble and Squeak

Vegetables and food that have been left over after a Sunday dinner must not be thrown away. They can be a great help in war economy.

For instance if you find that after a Sunday dinner, there is some cabbage and potatoes left, don't throw them away but mesh the cabbage and potatoes together, make them into flat little cakes, sprinkle some flour on them and put them into a very hot frying pan, until brown. We call this delicacy, Bubble and Squeak. This can be served with a fried chop or fried steak.

### Stale Bread made into Pudding

Stale bread should never be thrown away, for it can be grated and made into a Steamed Pudding. The same thing can be done with dried up cheese. Grate the cheese, and you can make a very nice Cheese Pudding out of it.

### Spare Your Tears

To save unnecessary tears when peeling onions, always put a steel needle, whether sewing or knitting between your teeth, and you will spare your tears for better things.

### Needle-Work Hints

Old and torn silk stockings should never be thrown away. They can be cut into long strips and crotchetted into very fine mats.

People who are knitting socks for the soldiers should learn that the best way of knitting quickly, is to cast in two pairs of socks at a time. Then keep on knitting a little on one sock, then on the other. In this way you will find that you have done many pairs of socks in a short while.

## Swat That Fly

Germs from dirt and refuse on which flies alight are carried to our food. In the same refuse, flies lay eggs and breed.

Wise housewives protect all food, particularly milk, with net covers and fly-proof larder cupboards. In addition to setting fly-traps, see that all refuse is either buried or burned and never allowed to accumulate. Rubbish-bins should be securely covered. Filth and flies go together, but do not let either touch your food.

## A New Danger

(BY TAND'UBUNONO)

Leaving the ways of the White man, or civilisation, has brought to the Bantu many things that are good and useful, but it has also brought dangers and wars that are harmful.

I do not speak to-day of T.B. and V.D., those serious diseases that are doing so much harm among you, but of a milder evil.

It is, however, often serious in its results, it is neglected, and can do much harm to the health of the body.

I speak of "constipation." By this is meant that you do not "go outside" everyday.

This means that dirt and rubbish that ought to leave the body remain in the bowels and so poison the blood.

This may cause headaches, weakness, thinness of the blood, pains in the joints, pain in the stomach, piles, bad appetite and other troubles.

The reasons for such a condition, especially among you who live in the towns, are many. If you know the reasons, you can try hard to remove them, and so prevent these bad things coming to your bodies.

Often it is difficult to find a proper place in which to do what is needed when the "call" comes. The desire to "go outside" is resisted, and the bad habit of delay begins.

This may start in the years of school-going, especially with cruel and stupid teachers, who object to a child leaving the class-room to obey the "call of nature."

Bad home-training may be another cause. All mothers should see to it that the children learn the daily habit of getting rid of the waste materials from the bowel.

Laziness and ignorance on the part of young people may be another cause. Men who have to work in some of the big flats in the towns are sometimes not given proper places for this purpose, or they cannot be easily reached, and this causes trouble. This, of course, is the fault of the owners and builders of such places. In such a case the servants have a right to ask for a proper place to be provided.

The taking of wrong foods is another reason for the presence of constipation. The use of fine flour, No 1 mealie meal, and white rice is wrong, because these things do not supply enough of what is called "roughage" for the bowel. They are too quickly absorbed, there is no waste matter, so that the bowels get lazy in doing their proper work. The new brown bread helps this matter, it is much better for us all than the white bread, and I hope we shall never go back to the white loaf.

Many people do not eat enough vegetables and fruit, these help to cause a daily motion. The good old "imifano" (ugadole, imbuya, amaliblo and others), helped well in this way. Now that there are hard to get, you should all try to take bananas, oranges, pawpaws, tomatoes, cabbages, carrots, and turnips in your diet.

Take plenty of water to drink every day, but be sure it is clean water, this helps to wash out the drains of the body.

NOT ENOUGH EXERCISE is another thing that makes the inside works go wrong, especially for people who sit in offices all day long, or who ride much in taxis, or who loaf about instead of working.

WALKING TWO MILES EVERY DAY; DO SOME GARDENING (DIGGING, HOEING, RAKING) IF POSSIBLE; RUN A MILE; AND TAKE PLENTY OF BENDING EXERCISES AND YOU WILL NOT GET CONSTIPATED.

USING MEDICINES is another common cause. Castor-oil, salts, bile beans, roll the long list of "laxatives" all help to make things worse.

They do not cure the trouble. After a dose of salts, which may produce a good "clear-out," you will often be more constipated than you were before.

The use of an Enema once a week, in the Bantu fashion, (with the hips up) is better than doses of Castor-oil or salts.

REGULAR HABITS, PROPER FOOD, PLENTY OF WATER, MORE EXERCISE AND NO LAXATIVES ARE THE WAYS IN WHICH THIS "DANGER TO HEALTH" MAY BEST BE AVOIDED.

## To Peel Tomatoes Easily

I have found that an easy way to peel tomatoes for salads, etc., is to plunge them into boiling water for a few minutes. The skin may then be pulled off quickly and evenly, without impairing the flavour of the tomatoes.

## Exterminating Rats

There are numerous rat poisons on the market, most of them more or less effective. A good paste may be made by mixing about 1 oz. of phosphorus with 1 lb. of melted lard; it should be thickened, when cooling, with flour. Spread the paste on small pieces of bread or brown paper. The poison must never be placed where it might be taken by domestic animals, and should be removed as soon as it has achieved its purpose. Traps should be baited with fried bacon rind, toasted cheese, fat, or raw meat; they should not be touched with an ungloved hand or the "human scent" will warn the rats, and should always be scalded before being reset. Black henbane roots will frequently drive rats away from outhouses and barns.

## Dental Caries

Dental Caries—decaying teeth—can not only cause the unpleasant pain of toothache, but can also slowly ruin a whole set of good teeth and poison the entire system.

Mothers of school children should arrange for the frequent inspection of children's teeth, but it should not be forgotten that dental trouble may start long

## Night Terrors For Children

The attacks known as Night Terrors are most common in children between the ages of three and eight years, but there are cases in which the attack has been noticed at as early an age as eleven months. In its general symptoms the seizure resembles a very severe nightmare: the child wakes screaming, and is either found sitting up in bed, crouched in a corner of the bedroom, or he will rush out of the bedroom and fly to the nearest person. His face is set and terror-stricken, and his eyes staring, and he often cries that he sees frightful apparitions, which follow or threaten him. When he at last falls asleep again it is to start and mutter, and he will beg not to be alone. Frequently a large quantity of urine is passed either during or just after the attack. Care should be taken that the child is not left to sleep in the dark or alone, for a light burning brightly in the room and a familiar face meeting the child's eye at once on waking will do much towards breaking the spell and allaying its fears. Harshness in such cases is quite clearly out of place, and few pieces of cruelty can be greater than forcing a timid child, in whom threatening of these attacks have occurred, to go to bed in the dark, or to lie there without a light. Overpressure at school and too much homework are frequent causes of Night Terrors. Unsuitable food, irregular meals, lack of proper exercise in the fresh air, worry and over-excitement are all exciting causes. They must be eradicated and the child's bowels kept open.

## SOCIETY FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

The records of the Society for September show that 56 reports of cruelty were investigated, 250 warnings were issued for minor acts of cruelty, and 289 verbal warnings were given.

The Motor Ambulances covered a distance of 3599 miles in collection of injured and unwanted animals.

404 Cats, 225 Dogs, 31 Horses, 2 oxen, 1 mule, 1 rabbit and 1 donkey were humanely destroyed.

CLINIC: 75 Dogs, 5 Cats, 60 Horses, 11 mules, 2 birds received treatment at the Clinic. 1 goat, 4 donkeys and 40 cows 6 dogs, cats, were detained for further treatment.

## *A Great Son Of Africa Passes*

His many friends will regret to learn the unexpected death of Evangelist J. Mota at the Non-European Hospital, Johannesburg on 1st November 1941 as a result of a motor-accident. His death is a great loss to church-work on the Rand and the African people as a whole.

Born in the Wakkerstroom district 65 years ago the late Evangelist J. Mota started on a career of a christian worker in his home town. He won the admiration of the Dutch Reformed church missionaries and in 1911 proceeded to the Stofberg Gedenkskool where he was trained as an Evangelist. In 1914 he came to Johannesburg and rendered creditable service at Ferreira, Sophiatown and Orlando for the last 27 years. Although a preacher, he was also a great educator at heart. The schools at Ferreira (later transferred to Orlando) and at Sophiatown owe their existence mainly to his efforts. Nothing pleased him more than the educational advancement of his people. He was a staunch member of the Transvaal Interdenominational Ministers' Association and was Treasurer for several years.

He is survived by his wife, three sons and three daughters: Mr. Hosea Mota of Stuttaford and Co. Ltd., Mr. S. Mota, Principal of the Orlando Dutch Reformed School, Mrs. Emily Ramp, Mrs. Alina Chakane, Mr. Abel Mota and Miss Naidoo Mota, a student at Stofberg.

The funeral was one of the largest on the Reef. Rev. P. H. A. Fouche assisted by Rev. A. P. Segoe, Rev. Coetze, Rev. W. Lebona, Rev. A. Tlhohle and Rev. Mpitso all paid tribute to the great work and sterling qualities of the late Evang. J. Mota. Mrs. Mota and family thank all who contributed towards its success. The collection amounted to £26 2s. 2d.
