MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, BANTU MEN'S SOCIAL CENTRE, HELD IN THE COMMITTEE-ROOM ON THURSDAY 11TH NOVEMBER, 1954 AT 5 P.M.

1. MINUTES: The Minutes having been circulated were taken as read and adopted.

2. MATTERS ARISING:

(a) The Chairman read a letter from the Chairman of the Non-European Social Workers Association informing the meeting that the National Executive Committee was arranging to meet the Officers of the Transvaal Social Workers to find ways of solving their differences - ACCEPTED.

(b) Arising out of Item (8) Section (a) of the Minutes dealing with the Trustees of the Centre, Mr. Pim pointed out that Trustees were necessary to deal with matters such as lease of the land and disposal of real property of the Centre.

After discussion Mr. Hough moved That the Chairman, Treasurer and one African member be appointed to act as the Centre's Trustees.

In accepting the motion the meeting, appointed the following as Trustees:-

(c) Arising out of Item (8) Section (b) of the Minutes - regarding the painting of the building, the Chairman reported having spent the sum of £15. 0. 0. for the internal painting of the Kitchen, Senior Billiards Room and the metal Up-rights of the Hall - This action was CONFIRMED.

3. CORRESPONDENCE: Applications for the use of the Hall were received and dealt with as follows:-

(a) From the Association of European and African Women applying for a refund of the money they paid for the use of the Hall: after discussion the meeting AGREED that they be told that as they did not loose on the function no refund could be granted.

(b) From the Association of European and African Women, Western Native Township Branch pointing out that their Show of the 29th

October, 1954 proved a financial failure and that they would be grateful if the Centre Committee could grant them another date early next year or give them financial help.

The meeting in discussing this moved that this branch of the Association be refunded their money for the hire of the Hall less £1. 1. 0. which had been used for the payment of the Home Guards and Cleaners and further, that they be advised to apply for a vacant date next year which would be considered in the usual manner. AGREED.

(c) From the Secretary of the Zenzele Y.W.C.A. for a Dance on the 4th March, 1955. GRANTED.

(d) From Mr. Campbell for purposes of holding a Wedding Reception on the 29th December, 1954. GRANTED.

(e) From the Transvaal Association for Non-European Professional Boxing for a tournament on the 27th November, 1954.

Mr. Mampuru moved that the meeting confirm the Sub-Committee's action of having granted them the use of the Hall. AGREED.

(f) From Mr. Mbatha, Assistant Secretary applying for Annual Leave. The Chairman pointed out that Mr. Mbatha's official leave is due on the 1st January of each year. The meeting AGREED that Mr. Mbatha should apply then.

At this stage Mr. Hough enquired as whether the meeting still wished to engage Students during the School holidays. The meeting AGREED and expressed its appreciation for the co-operation it received from the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work in the past.

4. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT ON FOUNDERS DAY: Reporting on the 1954 Founders Day the Chairman informed the meeting that the programme had included the following:-

(i) Guest Speaker The Right Reverend A. Reeves.

(ii) Musical Items provided by the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work Choir.

(iii) Dance Music provided by the African Swingsters, who generously offered to perform for the Centre free of charge.

In thanking the Chairman for the fine programme the meeting further, moved that a letter of appreciation be written by the Chairman to the African Swingsters Band and the Hofmeyr School Choir thanking them for their services. AGREED.

At this stage Mr. Pim enquired from African members of the Executive Committee, as to what accounted for their absence from this most important Day of their Centre.

In reply Mr. Mampuru said, some of them did not attend because they were engaged in political matters, e.g. rents in the Township.

In affirming Mr. Pim, Mr. Koza expressed his disappointments at the failure of the African members to attend the Founders Day - from year to year.

All the African members expressed regret for having failed to attend and undertook to make all possible efforts to attend next year. ACCEPTED.

5. MEMBERSHIP: The Chairman on behalf of the meeting expressed his satisfaction on the work done by the Secretaries and wished that they keep the same spirit of following up old members.

The meeting looking through the figures suggested that in addition to giving the monthly renewals at each meeting - the Secretaries should also reflect the total strength of membership up-to-date as compared to those in arrears. AGREED.
