#### REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1946.

To be presented to Members at the Forty-fifth Ordinary General Meeting, to be held in the Council Chamber of the Transvaal Chamber of Mines, on Monday, the 28th day of April, 1947, at 10 a.m.

Gentlemen,

We beg to submit our Report on the operations of the Association for the year ended 31st December, 1946, together with the Audited Accounts.

#### RECRUITING.

The following figures show the numbers of Natives obtained by the Association and its Members from all sources during 1946:—

#### WASTAGE.

#### DESERTIONS.

Annexure "E" shows the desertions among Natives employed by Members for the years 1945 and 1946.

#### ACCOUNTS.

#### CAPITAL

The Authorized Capital of the Association remained unaltered throughout the year under review, viz., 59,800 shares of £1 each, of which 59,754 shares had been issued, fully paid, at 31st December, 1946 £59,754 0 0

#### LOANS FROM MEMBERS.

The Members' Loan Account, established in 1943, remains unaltered at £150,000.

#### INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The financial results for the twelve months under review disclose a net deficit of £25,104 19s. 9d., after providing for Depreciation £20,364 2s. 4d. This amount has been written off against Reserve Account, in terms of Art. 79 of the Articles of Association.

Funds Appropriated.—After providing for items of Special Expenditure incurred in Tropical Areas during the year, the balance on this account is reduced to £23,056 19s. 7d.

Capitation Fees.—The Association's charges for Native labour supplied remained unchanged.

Costs.—The recruiting and administration costs (which include Head Office, Compound and Hospital Expenses) amounted to 3·30d. per contracted shift for 1946 as compared with 2·87d. for 1945.

#### TROPICAL AREAS ADMINISTRATION.

The total number of Tropical Natives engaged during 1946 was 31,779 as compared with 30,707 in 1945.

The death rate for the year 1946 from disease was 4.36 per thousand per annum as compared with 3.34 per thousand per annum in 1945.

Barotseland.—In July the Association, at the request of the Northern Rhodesia Government, re-opened recruiting in Barotseland.

Nyasaland.—The Nyasaland quota was increased in October from 8,500 to 12,750 and recruiting operations were resumed at the end of that month.

South West Africa.—The Agreement for the engagement by the Association of surplus Natives in South West Africa, although signed, is still not in operation. The refusal of the Windhoek Transportation Board to grant motor carrier licences to the Association from Grootfontein to the Bechuanaland border was overruled on appeal to the Central Road Transportation Board in Johannesburg, but certain other obstacles remain and the Agreement must remain in abeyance until these are overcome.

General.—The development of other areas continues.

#### HEALTH OF NATIVES.

The Report of your Chief Medical Officer (Dr. Frank Retief) is attached. The death-rate during the years 1946 and 1945 among Native labourers employed by Members of the Association was as follows:—

The above figures are based on deaths occurring on the Mines, and do not include deaths occurring among recruits and repatriates in the Association's Compounds. These latter number 202 (vide Mortality Return) and, if included, the death-rate from disease only for 1946 is increased to 3.54 per thousand per annum, as compared with 4.20 for 1945.

The welfare of Natives in Mine Compounds received the earnest attention of the Transvaal Mine Medical Officers' Association, the Health Advisory Committee, and the Compound Managers' Association throughout the year.

#### COMPOUNDS (JOHANNESBURG, WITBANK AND BREYTEN).

During the year the total number of Natives who passed through the Association's Compounds was 407,665. Included in this figure are 88,309 time-expired Natives for repatriation, viz., East Coast 61,072 and Tropicals 27,237.

The total amount of cash handled was £511,632.

#### PAYMENT OF ACCIDENT COMPENSATION TO MINE NATIVES.

The operations of the Central Medical Boards, established at Johannesburg and Witbank to determine the degree of incapacitation sustained by Natives through mine accidents during the year, were as follows:—

#### SILICOSIS ACT, 1946.

With effect from 1st August, 1946, the Miners' Phthisis Acts Consolidation Act of 1925 and the Miners' Phthisis Amendment Acts of 1930, 1934, 1936, 1938, and 1941 were superseded by the Silicosis Act, 1946 (Act No. 47 of 1946). Cases of silicosis and pulmonary tuberculosis amongst Mine natives continue to be handled at your Johannesburg compound in collaboration with the Silicosis Board and the Silicosis Medical Bureau (so styled in the new Act) and with the Native Affairs Department.

#### MASS RADIOGRAPHY OF NATIVES.

From July, 1942, all Portuguese Natives who had not previously worked on mines or who had remained at home for two years or more after a period of mine work were, as a routine measure, radiographed at the W.N.L.A. Compound by means of the miniature process. As medical opinion was satisfied that, in the case of Portuguese Natives, the experiment had served its purpose, it was agreed that the application of mass radiography was no longer necessary. In the case of Union Natives, however, it was decided that all such Natives entering mining employment under contract for the first time subsequent to 1st January, 1947, should be subjected to examination by miniature radiography. Natives of all classes who have long labour histories or whose physique is poor will continue to be radiographed, in accordance with the regular practice introduced in January, 1942.

#### SOUTH AFRICAN INSTITUTE FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH.

The Association's grant to the Institute remained at £7,500 per annum. The Union Government contributed a like sum.

The Institute continues to render valuable service to Members of the Association.
