SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE OF ISAAC GENU

1. ISAAC GENU, the Vice President of the 1st Applicant, will give evidence relating to the formation of the 1st Applicant in February 1981 and the events leading thereto.

2. He will further give evidence relating to a mass meeting held at the Roman Catholic Church, St. Peter's Mission, Kagiso 1, on the 1st Sunday in August 1981 at which meeting residents voted against proposed rent increases. Further matters on the Agenda which were discussed were proposed bus fare increases and the building of a hostel for men. He will go on to give evidence relating to the proposed meeting on the following day with the West Rand Administration Board, and how it came about that he, the Chairman of the 1st Applicant and the Secretary, were arrested on that day.

3. The further evidence to be given by this witness will relate to the allegations by the Respondent's that the 1st Applicant aims to further the object and strategies of the African National Congress. He will deny this and will explain what the aims and objects of the first Applicant are with particular reference to the Constitution.

He will, in this regard, give evidence of the type of problems that are dealt with by the first Applicant at the instance of residents of the townships of Kagisa and Munsieville.

SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE OF BRENICA BOBE LETLOLE

1. BRENICA LETLOLE will give evidence with regard to the finding of MAKI LEGWETE in an open field, east of the Convent and her subsequent transportation to hospital.

2. She will say that on 27 January 1986 she was in the yard of her home when she saw hippos travelling in the direction of the St Peters School, shortly after which she heard the sound of shots and smelt teargas.

3. After entering her house, which is situated in Paswayo Street, opposite the open field to the east of the Convent grounds, so as to escape the effects of the teargas, she saw a number of children running across the field towards Paswayo Street and noticed some of them apparently hiding in the field.

4. Shortly thereafter she noticed an armoured vehicle travelling in Paswayo Street from the direction of the St Peters School in an easterly direction, after which it turned left and drove into the field, stopping in front of a little girl sitting in the field. She will further state that the said armoured vehicle did not stop for very long, after which it reversed and cut across towards Paswayo Street, and turned back in the direction of the school. At no time

were any shots fired from this vehicle.

5. Thereafter she went to the assistance of the said girl who was bleeding profusely from a wound on her forehead and other wounds in different parts of her body.
6. She and another person carried this girl to the yard of their neighbours, after which she was taken to Leratong Hospital.
7. On her way to the hospital, the young girl who did not speak coherently, told the witness that her name was MAKI and shortly afterwards became unconscious. At the hospital she was admitted and attended to by a doctor. A drip was put into her and her head bandaged.
8. The witness subsequently discovered that her name was MAKI LEGWETE.
9. The following day the witness learnt that MAKI had died.
