

Dear Mr. Smit,

May I refer you to my letter of 13/11/1940 & your
reply of 30/11/1940 & our conversation of some
weeks ago in which you said you would be
willing to ~~re~~consider a scheme for the training
of African Sanitary Inspectors.

It is quite clear that, as your ~~letter~~
Commission pointed out in ~~its~~ ^{its} Report, that
there is great need for properly qualified Africans
in this field.

I attach a copy of the evidence of this
Institute to the Health Services Commission
in which the arguments as previously set out
to you in favour of training ^{officers} for the R.S.I. ~~is~~
are brought up to date.

You will realise that not one single
African came forward for the ~~suff~~ lower

certificate suggested in 1940 for Africans only.
They are accepting the raising of standard
for the R.S.T. Santos Inspector's Certificate
~~to matriculation~~
with equanimity but they do wish to take
a certificate of ~~accepted~~ recognised
Standard.

We are convinced that a class of
at least 15 young men ^{with the prequalification} could be
established in 1944 & complete the
course by the end of 1946. ~~But~~ The
Technical College will establish the class
if the fees are guaranteed.

In the past there have been three reasons
~~for~~ the non continuance of the course & therefore for
the being ~~for~~ practically no output of the
trained ^{certificated} men.

(1) Inadequate prequalification. This with
the malnutrition prerequisite is unlikely to
occur again.

2) ~~Financial~~ ^{financial} difficulties which means
unpaid fees, difficulties of transport, no books etc.

To meet this it seems essential that a
Bursary scheme should be established. No
~~African~~

3) Inadequate practical opportunity. To meet
this it ~~is~~ is necessary that the local
Municipalities should cooperate employing
the young men as learners ~~under their~~
~~N.H. &~~ Health Depts. during their two year
study. I have reason to believe that the
Municipalities ~~would~~ are interested & that
they would cooperate providing the practical
training experience + ^{reasonable} salaries for such learners.

The scheme I would suggest is that
15 Bursaries of £30^{pa} ^{for 2 years} be granted by ^{the Trust} N.A.D.
to approved Africans. Total Cost to N.A.D. Trust. £900

That the Municipalities agree to employ
these ~~trainee~~ learners in their Native Health Services
at ~~at~~ less than £6 p/w (+ cost of living allowance)
for the first year - £7 p/w (+ cost) for the second year

+ uniform ~~for~~ ^{the necessary} to set them free for attendance
at Technical College Classes.

~~All~~ ~~the~~ I would now suggest ~~the~~ ~~the~~ Statute
for another class in 1945 - but rather that at
the end of 1945 the success of the scheme
should determine its further continuance. I
am myself of opinion that the success will
be such that Municipalities will after that
not only employ the learners during their training
but offer Bursaries so that the course may not only
be continued in Job. but established elsewhere.

I may say that I have hopes that if
the ~~Job~~ ~~Trust~~ ^{will} would provide these 15 Bursaries
another 5 could be obtained from private
sources.

I am very willing, if you wish it, to undertake
the negotiations with the Municipalities as
to the learners' employment.

These R.S.I. Painters Inspectors would
be prepared for urban work at the moment.

the senior rural offices with B.Sc. Hygiene + field
training (to replace the ^{previous} ~~present~~ medical
aid training) are provided for. The schemes
rural cert.

for the provision of a 2nd grade (comparable
with the R.S.T. certificate) are not properly
established though they are of great urgency.

You will see that our evidence to the Health
Services Com. practically coincides with that
^{we gave} your own Com. in 1939. ~~I do not~~ be at
convinced of the urgency of this training but its
establishment & finance seems rather a
matter which we should take up with
the Dep. P.H. + I will ad- develop the matter
further in this letter.

As you ~~will~~ are aware the ~~San~~ Health officials
adv. pressed upon the ~~Committee~~ Commission
the advisability of establishing a higher urban
Sanitary Officer's Cert. to be taken after B.Sc. Hygiene.
My wife prepared a ~~further~~ statement on this which
she had to put before the Commission in her own

name as ~~the~~ there was no time to put
it before our Executive. While we can have
nothing but appreciation for the desire of that
Assoc. to ~~raise~~ ~~establish~~ have a very high
standard in the training of all Health
Officers ~~it does~~ & while I should agree
that a senior certificate of that standard
might well be established at an early
date for urban Sanitary officials (corresponding
to the B.Sc. Hygiene & rural training proposed
to replace medical aids) I should deprecate
the discontinuance of the R.S.T. training &
examination for some years to come, particularly
for Africans as we want the ~~the~~ Inspectors
as soon as possible in considerable
numbers & the other course is much longer.
R.S.T. may have its drawbacks, but it
is a well recognized Institution & its
certificates are a sign of reasonable capacity

~~actually~~

for many years to come we could
use the young men to ^{the} great advantage
of our urban locations.

May I beg you to give
favourable consideration to the
proposal scheme.



You will be glad to hear, I know, that one of the best of our 2nd year R.S.I. students - T.D. November - at present employed in the Compound Manager's Office at New Kleinfontein G.M., has been appointed as the first Native Health Assistant by the Capetown City Council at Langa Location, on a salary grade £121 - £150 - £180, plus quarters

Dear Mrs. Rheinallt Jones,

I enclose a few notes along the lines of our recent talk.

On thinking things over, I am not sure that my idea of regional certificates is too good. For one thing, it introduces complications to the scheme. For another, we all recognise that specialisation - if one can call it such in this humble connection! - can only follow a general basic training, and that in this as in all technical callings it is post-certificate experience under senior workers which must be relied upon to produce real competence. But I am not sure about a division into training for rural and for urban work; although I recognise that the small town differs little, qua health needs and possibilities, from the large kraal or stad.

With regard to the length of the course of training, if and when we can put up a proposal to run a course on a full time basis of say six weeks at 7 hours a day (practical-cum-theory), I do not think there will be any difficulty in persuading the R.S.I. to accept this in lieu of 200 hours spread out over six months given at nights to men who are probably already pretty tired. Perhaps a tentative enquiry at this stage would be useful, although it might be as well to say nothing.

Dr. Allan is a member of the R.S.I. Board in S.Africa, so will be aware of any moves being made in the direction of modification of its proposals.

Notes on the

EXAMINATION FOR SANITARY AIDS (NON-EUROPEAN).

Regarding the Regulations -

No. 2. - Experience of Drs. Anning and Gale in teaching for R.S.I. Certificates at Maritzburg & Benoni was that students with less than Std. VIII preliminary education were so handicapped by limits of vocabulary and idiom that they could not assimilate the substance of lectures. The language handicap is accentuated by the lack of knowledge through personal contact with many of the things mentioned in lectures which are familiar to Europeans regardless of their standard of education. Mission doctors with experience of lecturing to nurses would confirm this point. Probably the R.S.I. authorities are unaware of the rapid strides in Native education of recent years.

No. 8. - As there is constant progress in health & sanitation matters, particularly in relation to South African Native needs, certificates should be valid for a limited period - say 6 years - and renewable only upon completion of a refresher course, or at least an examination, or upon the certificate of a full time M.O.H. as to competence.

Regarding the Syllabus:-

Para. 1 - For those who are to work in rural areas, the knowledge should not be elementary but very $\frac{1}{2}$ thorough, as the Aids will be up against older men who will not accept suggestions unless they show signs of knowledge more complete than their own.

Para. 2 - This could well be sacrificed for the sake of Para 1, as amended above. Dairies ... to stables are not allowed in urban locations as a rule, and if they are their inspection will not be left to mere Aids but will be handled by the fully qualified inspectors.

Para. 3 - ADD - Practical knowledge of simple domestic methods of water purification and storage.

Para. 4 - ADD - with special emphasis upon the feeding of infants and small children and the care and utilisation of foodstuffs available to Native communities.

And ADD, what is omitted altogether, - The principles and practice of personal hygiene, including care of the skin, teeth, sense organs, feet, bowels; the use and abuse of clothing.

And ADD - or is this too advanced? - Elementary principles of psychology and ~~individual~~ individual and mass propaganda.
