At the two Institutions which are graded as Aided Institutions fees are paid. These Institutions are the Khale Agricultural and Industrial School and the Tati Training Institutions, and the rates of fees were:-

Khale Agricultural and Industrial School.

Agricultural Course: 1st and 2nd years: £8.10.0 p.a. 1st and 2nd years: £8. 0.0 p.a. Industrial Course: Third Year : Free.

In certain cases exemption from fees is granted and there are facilities for pupils to earn money which can be used for the payment of fees. The matter of scholarships is under consideration.

Tati Training Institution.

Boarders:

Stds. V —VI	£6.10.0. p.a. for boys. £5.10.0. p.a. for girls.
Stds. VII—VIII	£7.10.0. p.a. for boys and girls with reduction when there are are two or more children of one family attending.

Day Scholars:

Stds. V -- VIII Half fees.

At the Bamalete National School fees are not paid by members of the Bamalete Tribe, but for pupils who come from outside the Bamalete Reserve a fee of 12/- per annum is charged.

In the Ngwato and Bakgatla Reserves the average rate of fees paid is 4/- per annum per child but when there are two more children in a family attending school at the same time a reduction of fees is made.

EUROPEAN:

At most of the European schools fees are imposed by the local school committees of management.

The average rate of fees paid is approximately 18/-aquarter for each child, but when two or more children of one family attend the same school, the fees for each child are reduced proportionately.

Money from fees, subject to the approval of the Government, is used for various purposes, such as the purchase of books and equipment, repairs to buildings and in one or two instances to assist with salary payments.

Instances of inability to pay fees are investigated by the committees and in a number of cases they are either reduced or totally remitted.

COLOURED:

Fees are not paid in respect of pupils attending the Coloured Schools.
