From Japan I will send you a letter & telling you all, but after that I am afraid for 6 months you will not hear from me. However I am having word here at Vladivostok with a friend of mine (Bogdanoff) Radomtseff knows him, to send you now & again a few words telling you that I am alive, - as they - here will know by Radio where I shall be. So I hope that in the absence of other communications this will at least be something. As soon as navigation begins again in the Spring, - say about April you shall here again from me. I trust you on all

Keeping well & making the best of things under circumstances. I have told you in my last letter how I have arranged things, and if during the few months I will be in a position to increase the sum allotted to you I will immediately do that. I trust I will be able to do so without much difficulty; only it is rather premature to forecast exactly now.

I am also writing to my brother as I have told you already in my last letter. Please name dear if you need any help, that is if the money does not reach you (although I am perfectly sure it will every month) write to Natzenus through Radomtseff's help. Let Radomtseff write in Russian to Natzenus at the following address;
