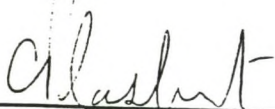

RE: STATE v DOUGLAS TORR : APPEAL

We refer to the above matter and attach our statement of account for the period 3 March 1991 to 3 June 1991. We hope that it meets with your approval.

We argued Rev. Torr's appeal against sentence on 20 May 1991 before Judge Lazarus and Judge Gautschi. We were successful in that the sentence of one years imprisonment was set aside and replaced with 800 hours of community service. Rev. Torr will serve this at an Aids Centre where he will do counselling work.

The implications of the decision are far reaching. It has, for instance, prompted religious objectors to request the Minister of Defence to relieve them of any further obligations. It highlights the punitive nature of the community service rendered by religious objectors who are automatically 'sentenced' to one and a half times the number of days owed to the SADF. In addition, at least four criminal matters have been withdrawn as a direct result of the Torr decision.



RE: CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTORS

We refer to the above matter and attach our statement of account for the period 2 May 1991 to 31 May 1991. We hope that it meets with your approval.

During this period we completed the trial of Peter Auf Der Heyde who was charged with failing to register for national service. We objected to the charge on the basis that it did not disclose an offence. Judgment was given on 29 May 1991. The magistrate held in our favour and consequently the matter ended there. We believe that this is an important breakthrough as it seriously impedes the ability of the SADF to obtain information for the purposes of conscription. We have been informed, however, that the State is considering appealing against the decision.

We were also involved in rather intense negotiations with the Hillcrest Regiment on behalf of Dirk Klopper. He was called up for a camp and has taken the view that he will not serve in the SADF. Our advice to him, however, was that we should attempt to obtain exemption or deferment for him rather than adopting a more hard line position at this stage.

We refer to the above matter and attach our statement of account for the period 1 April 1991 to 30 April 1991. We hope that it meets with your approval.

During this period we appeared in court for Clyde Wynter who is charged with failing to report for military service, Peter Auf der Heyde who is charged with failing to register for national service and Wayne Boshier who is charged with failing to report for national service. The only matter which has proceeded so far is that of Auf der Heyde. We have argued an objection to the charge and will receive judgment on 28 May 1991. The other two matters were postponed to 3 June 1991 for trial.

We have also rendered the usual advice to conscientious objectors relating to call ups, exemption and deferment. In this regard we have had one particularly important success. We made an application for exemption from national service for Kevin Lancaster who works as a field worker for Operation Hunger in a remote rural of area of Gazankulu. The Exemption Board granted

the application which absolves Lancaster of all obligations in terms of the Defence Act. This is most unusual and we hope that it is the beginning of a trend in the Exemption Board's decision making.

With effect from 1 October (1 November?), as a general principle Jacaranda Trust moneys will not be available to fund any legal cost incurred by individuals in conscription-related matters. This will apply both to initial and subsequent consultations whether by telephone or otherwise. Free advice is available from CAS and ECC.

Notwithstanding the above statement, the Jacaranda Fund is retaining a small reserve fund which it will be able to use to meet legal expenses in cases of financial hardship. To allocate such moneys it would require a motivated case to put to it: such motivation should include reason why it has not been possible to approach SALDEF or for SALDEF not to be able to meet the costs. The urgency of the matter and the amount of the cost to be incurred could also be relevant.

SALDEF should be approached in all other circumstances where there may be circumstances in which it is appropriate for costs, or part thereof, to be met from central funded sources.

This decision brings Johannesburg practice into line with practice in Durban and, to the best of our knowledge, Cape Town. The difference in practice has given rise to some concern in Durban amongst organisations and activists. ✓

This decision should not be taken to mean that organisations such as CAS, COSG and ECC cannot and should not be charged directly for work done for them on agreed bases. ✓
