- 1st M. Party at the Cottage, S. Alice, S. Georgina, D. Taylor. In. Benbow. Went up Lighthouse Hill p.m.
- 2nd T Public holiday: joined the Sharp family at the Bathing-Place a.m.: returned home for dinner: they came here for tea.
- 3rd W Wet all day: wash. girl could not come: played much Patience.
- 4th Th Cleared up: washing done. S. G. In. B. & D. J. bathed p.m. Mrs Cock came to look at stove. Rector visited us a.m.
- 5th F In. B. & D. J. to East London a.m. S. G. later to see about a Piano for S. Rose. S. G. In. B. & D. J. bathed. After Tea Reading on the Storp, Vespers on the Rocks - Benediction. Mrs Cock brought Mr Weston to see the Kitchen. Stove: got ready for Retreat.
- 6th S. Feast of the Epiphany All in Retreat. S. Priscilla joined us for meals: 2 addresses, 10 & 5 on our Baptism & Confirmation. Aunt's got into the safe & had to be evicted in silence. Sang Carols in the evening.

- 7th W. Mass at 8. & 11. Miss Martin came to tea & we went to see the Lighthouse: couldn't get in. Sr. Priscilla & Miss Hubback joined us.
- 8th M. M. Beubow & D. Taylor treated us to a motor to & from Shelley Beach: most lovely day left at 9.30, returned at 5. Packing & other preparations.
- 9th T. Sr. Alice & D. Taylor left for Pretoria Sr. G. & M. B. went to see them off - spent the rest of the morning on the rocks. Storm in the evening
- 10th W. S. G. & M. met Miss Martin. Rain after 11 a.m. prevented bathing. All three played Patience on back stoop
- 11th T. A wet day -
- 12th F. Rocks in the morning. Lighthouse hill in the evening. Benediction
- 13th S. Nurse Stubble came to breakfast. S.G. & M.B. bathed.

4 Very cold & windy. S & L. & M went across to the shops. S & L called to see Miss Hewitt

6 All went for a Picnic to Sandy beach lovely day

7 A very hot day. S & L went to see the Mission Sisters in E London.

8 S.S. L. & M went to Shelley Beach. M put to bed with cold
