

3rd W Wet all day: wash. girl could not come: played
much Patience.

4th Th Cleared up: washing done. S. G. M. B. & D. J.
bathed p.m. Mrs Cock came to look at stove.
Rector visited us a.m.

5th F. M. B. & D. J. to East London a.m. S. A. later to
see about a Piano for S. Rose. S. G. M. B. & D. J.
bathed. After Tea Reading on the Stoop, Vespers
on the Rocks - Benediction. Mrs Cock brought
the Westor to see the Kitchen. Stove: got ready
for Retreat.

6th S. Feast of the Epiphany All in Retreat. S. Priscilla
joined us for Evens: 2 Addressers, 10 & 5
on our Baptism & Confirmation. Crows
got into the safe & had to be evicted in silence.
Sang Carols in the evening.

7th & 8th hours at 8. & 11. Miss Martin came to Isla & we went to see the Lighthouse: couldn't get in. S. Priscilla & Miss Hubback joined us.

8th. M. M. Beubow & D. Taylor treated us to a motor to & from Shelley Beach: most lovely day left at 9.30, returned at 5. Packing & others preparations.

9th G. St Alice & D. Taylor left for Pretoria
St. G. & M.B. went to see them off -
spent the rest of the morning on
the rocks. Storm in the evening

10th W. S.G. & H. met Miss Martin. Rain
after 11 a.m. prevented bathing.
All three played Patience on back
stoop.

11th G. a wet day -

12th-T. Rocks in the morning. Lighthouse
hill in the evening. Benediction

13th S. Nurse Stubble came to breakfast.
SG & M.B. bathed.

called to see Mr Hewitt lovely weather & so hot, everyone took off winter clothes & put on summer ones

2nd S.E. d. & I went over to East London & walked to Sandy beach returning about 5.30

3 S.E. d. & I went over to Mass at 7. All at 11. S.E. went in to see Mrs Day in the afternoon. All to Evensong.

4 Very cold & windy. S.E. d. & I went across to the shops. S.E. called to see Miss Hewitt

5 All went for a Picnic to Sandy beach lovely day

7 A very hot day. S.E. went to see the Mission Sisters in East London.

8 S.E. d. & I went to Shelley Beach. I put to bed with cold
