NB Over half of 500 million signatures to Stockholm Peace Appeal were collected by women.

BANTU EDUCATION PROTEST CONFERENCE : PORT FLETCHER  
APRIL 1954

1953. to The Congress of Women - Copenhagen  
(Sept. 15). 2000 delegates from 70 countries (film)  
formulated declaration of Women's Rights, and resolved  
to work for peace.

1954 - 140 millions in 66 countries.  
Important Women's Congresses held in many countries -  
Brazil, Indonesia, Japan, India, Israel, Sweden,  
Norway, Denmark, Austria, France - and  
South Africa.

After Congress discussion followed in all parts of the world. - women of all social backgrounds were reached - towns, villages, and also to oppressed and backward countries.

Appeals to W to become conscious of rights / strength + power to improve conditions thro' their own efforts.

March 8<sup>th</sup> International W's Day celebrated in 70 countries - hundreds of thousands of women

also 58 conferences in 32 countries > unity amongst women on broad scale, as women of all ranks & ways of life

Asian African women emerging united out of the struggle for progress and independence. - reaching f. association of organised and unorganised women. > W.O.D.F.

Resolutions express aspirations of women and determination to play a part in the women's movement + national struggle.

Women in feudal countries pressing forward for their and their children's rights, becoming conscious that forces which condemn them to an inferior status - forces which exploit their countries:

W's Ideation stimulates the study of women - strongest force in the world - the women's world

Women are seeking to break down national and racial barriers

Development of society demands direct participation of an ever growing no. of women in the economic, social & cultural life of the countries. Contribution & progress becomes more & more important.

W. Conf. Women Declaration of rights inspired millions of women and in many countries struggle for economic rights (equal pay etc) is progressing rapidly on a broad basis - organized women in trade unions etc are already v. active, but federations W's conf. can unite the unorganized women. (eg. Campaigns in Italy, Sweden, Finland, Brazil, Latin America.)

Campaigns effective because women's org<sup>s</sup> > all women. (differential pay is being realized for the danger that it is - not merely show to dignity of women but also danger to standards of living.)

Campaigns also among peasant women - unorganized people  
Special Campaigns on peasant women - Italy, Finland, France, India, Indonesia,

(Campaigns for social services)  
Cameroon, Kenya, Sudan, etc. Latin America Guatemala -

Peasant women are becoming more conscious of their miserable conditions and their own potentiality.

Rights of mothers - protection @ work, protection of children etc.  
- woman is not something separate from the family.

Japan, Italy, W. Germany, S.B., Brazil, Cuba, Italy - National Conferences in defence of the home. <sup>in these</sup> The countries v. Cost of living etc, v. Divorce, for decent houses -

Workers' votes - now organizing together with their husbands, coming out of households - housewives leagues - of SA.
