Page 17. Para 30. Line 2. After "Hat" insert "Scout hat with red leather band."

27 42 2 for "badge" read "emblem".

8 for "P.R.S." read "R.S."

37 58 2 for "badge" read "emblem".

40 68 (a) At end of amended form omit "What ever other flags are flown this one shall be flown."

41 (b) Present (b) to become (c) and New (b) to read "The old Pathfinder flag."

(c) Omit present (c) and substitute present (b) For amendment "In the High..... ..only will be flown" and substitute in square brackets "Local arrangements may be made for the High Commission Territories."

43 72 (a) 6 For amended "Scouts" read "Pathfinder Scouts".

All other amendeents together with the Proposed Additions and Alternatives for Proficiency Tests are approved and should be inserted in the appropriate places in the Scouts Tests.
