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YOUTH YEAR 1985

- 1. The Honourable the Minister of Constitutional Development announced on 23 May 1984 that the South African Government, associating itself with the International Youth Year 1985 as announced by the United Nations, would similarly lay particular emphasis on youth during 1985.
- 2. The Education Department identifies itself with this announcement and makes a cordial appeal to Principals to pay increased attention to youth activities during 1985. The target group, upon which will be focussed in particular, is the group aged between 15 and 24, but in the context of the school the younger pupils should also be included in school projects.
- 3. The following aspects are of importance when activities are being organised and schools and communities are asked to bear them in mind when programmes are being drawn up:
- 3.1 SLOGAN

The following has been adopted as the slogan: PARTICIPATION, DEVELOPMENT, PEACE.

3.2 EMBLEM

The United Nations emblem, which is depicted hereunder, has been adopted as the official emblem. It is a representation of youth on the path to a better, happier future, within a laurel wreath which suggests peace.



3.3 NATIONAL YOUTH WEEKEND

It is the desire of the Government that a National Youth Weekend should be celebrated throughout the Republic, on a regional or a local basis, from 15 to 17 March 1985. Friday 15 March, may be used by schools to organise a memorable youth day or youth evening, locally or on a regional basis. Youth and sports organisations can arrange programmes for Saturday, 16 March, while religious organisations care for Sunday, 17 March.

(N.B. It is recommended that an indication be given on printed programmes that the programme is dedicated to the Youth Year 1985. Use may be made of the slogan and the emblem.)

- 4. Initial arrangements with regard to the co-ordination of events will be undertaken by the Chief Inspectors, Regional Chief Inspectors and Inspectors of Education. Principals and teachers are, nevertheless, requested to take the initiative in the planning of youth programmes in the sports, religious and cultural organisations in which they serve and to use their influence to ensure the successful implementation of the youth programmes of 1985.
- 5. The Education Department is aware of the wide variety of youth activities which take place within the context of the school situation, and these are greatly appreciated. Thus, as an initial step it is requested that the following activities be developed and strengthened:.
- 5.1 A reinforcement of the Youth Preparedness Programme
- 5.2 Sports activities
- 5.3 Cultural interests eisteddfods, dramatic and theatre groups, choral groups, debating societies, clubs, S.C.A., etc.
- 5.4 Youth organisations Land Service, Voortrekkers, Scouts, Girl Guides, hiking clubs, life-saving groups, etc.

- Youth Leaders Conferences, Youth Leadership programmes, Junior Town Councils, and Student Council 5.5 programmes
- 5.6 Guidance and Family Guidance
- 5.7 Olympiads, Careers Exhibitions, etc.
- Activities which could possibly enjoy attention at the local or regional levels are the following: 6.
- A memorable regional youth weekend from 15 to 17 March 1985, which would include, inter alia, vocal 6.1 music, choirs, folk dancing, athletics, gymnastics, cadets, bands, drum majorettes, torch runs, etc., with the United Nations slogan and emblem being displayed.
- Youth theatre the production of one-act plays 6.2
- Competitions for the composition of songs for youth 6.3
- 6.4 Photographic and Art competitions
- Environmental projects such as the prevention of pollution and the beautification of the environment 6.5
- 6.6 Youth conferences
- Family programmes 6.7
- Continuous youth activities throughout the year and the involvement of the greatest possible number of 6.8 youth organisations.
- As in the past, the Department is once again relying on the wholehearted co-operation of Principals and 7. teachers.
