overwhelmed by our protest - they

didn't take it as a personal  
level - they had never had such  
shelly nature, a warden  
replied as to the OC, & he  
said that a pair of wardens  
in revolvers. They stood waiting  
us but we didn't charge on at first.  
The OC ordered us to ~~get~~ <sup>get</sup> ~~forward~~ \*  
line up for impertinence. He impertinence  
us & then ordered us to dismount.  
That ~~was~~ was a defeat. On our  
shouted laughing. That was too  
much for him to take, so he  
shouted "Charge Re" - & it was
