



April

21<sup>st</sup> Holy Saturday. Great preparations for Easter. Canon Amore conducted the ceremonies beginning with the lighting of the Paschal Candle. - Vespers - procession to Easter garden etc. We began at 5:30<sup>pm</sup> and finished at 6:10 pm.

Father Hogg sang Mass at 7. There were 72 communicants. We all had tea in the garden at 10:30 am. Then after visiting S. Margaret's Rectory and the Assistant took part of the Easter offering to Canon Amore (20 rand) The rest (9 rand) was given to R. Blake

25<sup>d</sup> The Bishop failed to arrive at S. P. for Mass. so Canon Amore said it and the whole congregation for Holy T joined -

26<sup>th</sup> The Assistant S. I. Joy went to last Mass at 8:30 when Bp received Lent offerings. Later the Asst went to a Jane Furse meeting at Cathedral. S. I. visited Fr. Myer's Irene Church Vestry meeting met in Rec Room

28. D. Home brought Coloured children for picnic. The Asst  
fetches Sr Joan to stay. Mother, the Asst, Mrs Rorke &  
M. Daubton went to Elizabeth Hogg's wedding  
Fr Stanton came for weekend
29. David & Miss LeMay took Martha Mwaqi & 3/2 Selborn  
Nurses to Jane Furse Hospital to start Training (in Van)  
Sisters arrived for Retreat. Taken by Fr Fielding.
30. Sr I. Joy & Sr H. Clare to town & took Mrs Appel to Hospital
- May 2. Martha & family came to say goodbye before going  
to S. Michael's Manzini. Sally & Mrs Mandela brought  
Tshepo for the afternoon - a LOVELY day!
3. The Assistant took car to town for roadworthy test.
5. Retreat ended. Sr Joan & Fr. Mary stayed on  
Sr Margt Antony, Sr Yvonne Mary, Sr Irene Mary Tj. Droughton  
went to Guest day CR. Rosettenville

7. The Assistant drove Mother to Waverley

also went to tea with Mrs Soames

Fr Blake drove from Sphinton to say Mrs &  
Dorothy & Tuesday.

8<sup>th</sup> Mrs Hanway was brought from the O.S.G. to  
St. Margaret's as she needed nursing attention.  
Miss Pym returned and was met at the  
cross-road by St. Margaret's antony.

9<sup>th</sup> \* We went to Mass at the O.S.G. by van & car.

10<sup>th</sup> A priest of the O.S.G. stayed with Mrs Games  
for two nights and offered us 2 Masses.

11<sup>th</sup> The assistant left for Salisbury by air

12<sup>th</sup> No Mass. David drove a party from Tunbury  
to Johannesburg Cathedral. On returning he stayed  
a night at Tunbury and returned the van next day.

15<sup>th</sup> Fr Tschke said Mass. Sisters Agnes Crystal and Sgt Antley went shopping. S. Linda C.S.J.B. came for her rest-

16<sup>th</sup> <sup>No Mass</sup> S. Mary went to shops in Johannesburg.

Fr Hummuss arrived after an 'episode' with his car at the Johannesburg-Pretoria cross roads. Natta had supper at St. Elizabeth's.

17<sup>th</sup> Father Hummuss said Mass and heard confessions both here and at the D.S.G.

Miss Pym showed her transparencies to the girls.

18<sup>th</sup> 25 Nattas from St. Welfreda came to N. Ten and to see round.

S.D.R. passed through Jan Smuts air port on her way from Salisbury to Capetown.

Natta and S. Sgt. Antley met her and had about 30 men with her. Nearing Capetown

the plane ran into fog and was grounded at Sandhansen Bay where S.D.R. waited until

\* 22<sup>nd</sup> Fr Shrove arrived. S.H.C took her sister to

town and went to the dentist: Mr. Robinson back

24<sup>th</sup> Mrs Pym sailed for Durban on the Kenya Castle  
- East Coast route. S' O F took Grace to hospital

25<sup>th</sup> S' Ngt. Antony drove Fr Shrove and Sister Euphemia  
to the airport. Fr Shrove left for England on the  
11:30 plane.

26<sup>th</sup> S' Y N fetched Grace from hospital

27<sup>th</sup> ~~S.H.C.~~ Mass - church S' Irene Mary left for  
East London.

28<sup>th</sup> Pam Amone said Mass - Waverley started

29<sup>th</sup> S. Ngt. Antony drove Mother + S' Dorely to the airport  
to meet the Assistant who arrived from  
Capetown exactly at scheduled time. Her brother  
was also able to greet her, before boarding the  
same plane to go to Salisbury

30<sup>th</sup> Fr Whitnall said Mass. S. J. took S. Lucia & S. J. B. to Kipton

31<sup>st</sup> ASCENSION DAY.

Fr W. sang Mass. Fr Lewis assisted with the Chalice - This was the latter's first appearance in Chapel after his big illness.

We had camp fire pictures round the garden. Some of the lights faded at night but were eventually restored.

June 1<sup>st</sup> Father & the assistant went to tea at the D.S.G. Father Whitnall left pm.

The Bishop said Mass at 5 o'clock.

2<sup>nd</sup> No Mass. A girl ran away but was soon brought back.

3<sup>rd</sup> Fr Lewis sang Mass !!

2 blame came for the day. S. Lucia

4<sup>th</sup> No Mass. Father & the assistant went to Waverley

5<sup>th</sup> S. J. Antony met her niece - her husband who had flown from Kenya. They went to see S. Joan with a view to getting their youngest daughter into school. Canon Treke said Mass.

We put S. Lucia on the train for St. Cuthbert

6<sup>th</sup> Fr Lewis sang Mass for the night's and said

Mass time. He also gave an address - heard confessions here and at the school S.O.F Cook Nabeck to Hospital

8<sup>th</sup> Fr. Lammers left. Father and the assistant went shopping. S.O.F again took Nabeck to hospital and S. Sgt. stopped.

9<sup>th</sup> Fr. Lammers rang up to say that he had returned from hospital and would sing Mass on Sunday.

10<sup>th</sup> A sung Mass in Chapel for Pentecost.

11<sup>th</sup> <sup>No Mass</sup> A film was shown called "Northwick St." was most successful.

12<sup>th</sup> The Assistant and S. Joan took some girls to Joey Swanson at Vlakfontein where they distributed gifts of clothing. Father went to G.B. Meeting at school while the Assistant played and prayed with the sisters. Film finished.

13<sup>th</sup> 'Annual General Meeting'. Dr. Lammert was the Guest speaker and made a most interesting speech concerning Mental Health. The bishops of Pretoria and Johannesburg were both present, the latter stayed 2 nights.

14<sup>th</sup> Bishop Stradling said Mass - a very cold day. The Assistant & S. Euphemia were - retired.

15<sup>th</sup> The Bishop said Mass - another bitterly cold day. The electricity failed - unfortunately just before the bishop was due to leave.  
Sister Olive Frances - retired. Sr. Joan Augustine started a retired tent - was called out as one of her patients collapsed and died.

16<sup>th</sup> One of our African servants - Agnes - was conjoined.

17<sup>th</sup> The Assistant <sup>Fr. Lawrence Sany Mass.</sup> went to Rodeo for the night and took evening song. She also addressed the girls and afterwards answered questions in their recreation room.

18<sup>th</sup> The Assistant returned early and she - S. Hilary Clare, Judy and Margaret Hogg went for a picnic as it was Judy's birthday. Rather & S. Louise Mary went to the ~~the~~ Crematorium. In the afternoon we had a farewell party for Father Lewis and his wife. After Vespers Jocelyn arrived from the airport with her co-workers. We mobbed them in Joy and extricated as much mass of home as possible.

- 19<sup>th</sup> S.D.R. and Ray drove to Wilbank and The Assitant.  
addressed a meeting. Fr. Dennis arrived at 9:30 pm.
- 20 Father Dennis said Mass gave an address and  
heard confessions.
- 21<sup>st</sup> Corpus Christi Father Dennis sang his last Mass  
served by Ray Blake. Fr. Dennis had said a  
Mass and stayed at the back of chapel last.  
Fr. Dennis should be overcome. All was very well  
The Assitant went to visit Mrs. Jay and later she  
and Natter joined the parishioners at the station  
to say farewell to the Dennis.
- 22<sup>nd</sup> No Mass. The Assitant spoke to the High School  
girls about the Fido - brought S.A. Crystal from  
the market and S. Frances Mary from the O.S.G.  
The latter came to convalescence after Flu  
A meeting of the Building Committee at 2:30 pm.
- 23<sup>rd</sup> No Mass
- 24<sup>th</sup> We went to Mass at church - Natter's Professors  
Day.
- 25<sup>th</sup> No Mass  
Dorcen Chaplin came to discuss 'Ek' affairs  
Joey Swanson came to see us
- 26<sup>th</sup> Mass at Church  
The Assitant drove Natter to the 'Ek' meeting
- 27<sup>th</sup> Fr. Dennis Blake said Mass  
Natter's Retreat - Jocelyn came for the night.
