Fr. Cooke. S.P. + S.P.C. went
to the D.S.G. by car in the
morning, + returned in the
afternoon, bringing S.E.I. + Lena
with them.

Saturday 9th

No Mass. Teddy received into
the Church before Evensong.

Sept: 1933.

- Sun: 10th Sung Mass at 7.15. Great influx of visitors for the girls during the day. Solemn Evensong + sermon at 6.15 p.m.
- Mon: 11th No Mass. Sisters' meditation after Vespers, Evensong as usual. Miss Nunton came to stay 2 nights. S. Ad: + S.E.I. went to town by van in the morning, + Sr. Ad: had her supper in bed.
- Tues: 12th Mass at 7.15. Mrs. Gray + a friend came over in the morning. Mr. + Mrs. Fane came about 5.30, + brought a new girl, Sarah.
- Weds: 13th No Mass. Miss Nunton left by the 10.3 train. Solemn Evensong + Instruction at 6.30 p.m., but no Procession, as there were so few Sisters in the house. Fr. Bamfield came in the afternoon.
- Thurs: 14th Sung Mass at 7.15. Miss Holy + Tunks came to stay a few days.
- Fri: 15th Mass at 7.15. S.P. + S.E.I. went to town by car in the afternoon - to D.S.G. first, then shopping in town. Mr. de Noue left. Sr. Marie went by the van in the morning, + Sr. Erid came out by van for the weekend. Miss Tunks in retreat.
- Sat: 16th Mass at 7.15. 10 schoolgirls came over from Yeoville with Miss Trainger, Miss Benson, +

Mrs. Harris. They went everywhere, & saw everything. S.E. in retreat.

Sun: 17th Sun: 17th Miss Tunks emerged from retreat. No visitors at all! S.P.C. not well, so went to bed about 6.30. Solemn Evensong + Sermon at 6.15.

Mon: 18th No Mass here, but Mass at Church at 7 a.m. S.P. + Sr. Renée went; other Sisters rested. Sr. Emid went back to the D.S.G. by van. Fr. Cothe brought Fr. Northcott over about 3 p.m. S.P.C. better.

Tues: 19th Mass at 7.15. (Fr. Northcott.) Miss Tunks left at 2.32. A very windy dusty day.

Wed: 20th 7.15 Mass. (Fr. Northcott) Ember Day Day of Prayer - *Ammilihiti* *hiti* for all denominations in view of drought - general distress. Mother, S. Claudia - S. J. Emice returned at 11.50.

Solemn Evensong 6.45. Very windy & dusty Thurs: 21 7.15 Mass. (Fr. Northcott) & Mother Rev. Brooke arrived in the evening for a few days. Wind subsided. Mrs Gray came over.

Friday 22 7.15 Mass. Ember Day Mother & Pristinia by Van for fare fare getting. S. J. took girls to oculist in aftn.

joined mother at 2.30. They returned after tea bringing V. Felicitas with them for her Sat. Retreat. Lovely day.
